### FOUR WHEEL DRIVE DUES

DUES IS DUE AGAIN! In fact, after the Feb general meeting, dues will be overdue. State (\$2) and National (\$3) are optional, but not the \$10 for Four Wheel Drive.

#### **COMMENTICATIONS**

Do not refer to either 'base' station as "BASE". This mainly concerns low-band radio traffic. "BASE" is too easily confused with "BASECAMP". Refer to a 'base' station as either RADIO 1 or RADIO 2. RADIO 1 has both hi and low band, so it will help Jack if you identify which one you are using.

#### NEW RADIOS

About 70 hi-band mobile radios are available from the city for \$75 each, as is. Some are two channel, most are one. Most will need some work to get them operable, which can be minimized by having a person who knows what to look for to select one. It is also possible that the whole lot may be transferred to the Sheriff's Dept and Council control.

\* NO CME MAY OPERATE A PERSONAL RADIO WITHOUT AN APPROPRIATE LICENSE, OR PERMISSION FROM A LICENSE HOLDER !!! Permission to use a rescue frequency in your own radio will not be automatic!! The procedure is being created, and may require you to purchase crystals which are then donated to the licensee, so that control is retained by the licensee.
