FIRST AID NEWS

HAS YOUR FIRST AID CERTIFICATION EXPIRED?? The never-ending job of updating First Aid records has placed me in the position, again, of asking ALL personnel to contact me regarding their First Aid expiration dates. Thus far, only 2% of the field-qualified members have done so. As of May 1, 1981, all "callers" will be furnished with the names of persons no longer eligible for field operations due to expired First Aid (according to SARA's records). Therefore, as of May 1, 1981, if you suddenly stop receiving S & R calls you will know the probable reason. PLEASE call 881-6775 (Between 7 P.M. & 9 P.M.) or check with me at any SARA meeting. *** CALLOUTS ***

** Please submit all receipts for reimbursable expenses to Dolores Bartholomew, 8082 E. Coronado Road, Tucson, AZ, 85715, within seven (7) days of an operation. Receipts must include your name, mileage, and appropriate callout information. Reimbursable expenses include gasoline used during a callout and items lost, stolen or damaged. Items other than gasoline need a written description including age and how it was lost. Reimbursements are at the discretion of the Sheriff's Department, and ONLY AVAILABLE FOR SEARCHES AND/OR RESCUES. Include no. of gallons.

<u>Limited Callouts</u> - <u>Council Policy</u>

"Limited calls" or "stand-by calls" may be used where a "full callout" is not justified. In contrast to a full call requesting all personnel to respond to an incident, a standby call requests personnel to prepare but not to respond until a full call is received; a limited call may be used when a few specialized people are needed. In the event of a limited call involving one or more volunteers, a standby call will also be made to alert all volunteers.
