CALLOUTS

Limited Callouts -- Council Policy

"Limited calls" or "stand-by calls" may be used where a "full callout" is not justified. In contrast to a full call requesting all personnel to respond to an incident, a standby call requests personnel to prepare but not to respond until a full call is received; a limited call may be used when a few specialized people are needed. In the event of a limited call involving one or more volunteers, a standby call will also be made to alert all volunteers.

<u>Date</u>	<u>Situation</u>
Tuesday, June 2	Fall victim, 31-yr.-old male, Cat Mountain, carried out by rescue personnel in Stokes.
Saturday, June 13	Missing person, 91-year-old female, from area of 4700 N. Camino Escuela. 15 volunteers, Ranger and TP Helicopter responded. Victim found by relative.
Monday, June 29	Missing person, 72-year-old female, from residence in Green Valley, eventually found.
" " "	Missing person, 72-year-old male, from area of 5400 N. Royal Palm. Victim found 5 miles from home, near Cortaro & I-10.
" " "	Stranded climber, 19-year-old male, Inspiration Rock, Catalinas. Victim was extricated from the rock.
" " "	Stand-by page for Tanque Verde Falls; turned out to be a hoax.
Saturday, July 4	Limited callout, 19-year-old male, Italian Springs, Rincon Mountains. Victim suffering from heat exhaustion; airlifted by DM to TMC.
Tuesday, July 7	River callouts. Three vehicles were washed from Pantano R. at Craycroft. All occupants of vehicles exited on their own.
Wednesday, July 8	River rescue, 33-year-old male and 21-year-old female, Canada del Oro River at First Avenue. Ranger DPS 29 dropped flotation device and life jackets to the couple and then picked them up from their vehicle.
" " "	Fall victim, 22-year-old male, Seven Falls trail; ¼ mile from Falls. Victim sustained possible fractured ankle, numerous cuts and abrasions. DM did hoist pick-up.
