SARA'S CAVE RESCUE PRACTICE

SARA'S cave rescue practice on August 6th was a smashing success. Thirteen people attended the practice at the Cave of the Bells. While sitting at the resigter, two NERD reportees, who became rescuers as soon as we found the victim, told us that an old man had been attacked by a GIANT SONORAN CAVE SLUG. Don't know what a GIANT SONORAN CAVE SLUG is? Just ask someone who went. SARA members crawled through tight crawl-ways and slid and stomped through deep mud to find the victim about 500 feet from the entrance to the cave. SARA members easily negotiated the obstacles in the cave, but the victim on the Neal Roberts stretcher required a belay. The whole operation took about four hours. This makes you appreciate how few cave rescues SARA has to do.

DIVER'S PRACTICE AT PATAGONIA

Briefing for a practice at Lake Patagonia is very frustrating. Trying to keep your group's attention is not easy when your members are jumping up at the shouts and screams of swimmers who sound as if they are in trouble. First we familiarized ourselves with the different areas of the lake, where the previous drownings have taken place and basically what to expect once we hit the water. Trying to suit up in high temperature and high humidity proved to be a challenge for some of us, who ended up putting on the majority of our equipment in the water. The practice was to familiarize oneself with the lake bottom environment prior to actually having to perform on a recovery. We used two-person buddy teams with a rope between them to keep contact. There was actually about 2-3 feet visibility for about the first 10-15 feet, and below that visibility sharply decreased going from being able to detect light to total blackness near the bottom which we figured was about 40 - 45 feet at the deepest point. The thermocline we hit was a welcome relief. Trying to sweep the bottom, which is done by moving along the bottom with your stomach flat against the bottom and digging through about 1 ½ feet of silt, proved challenging because of the trees and fishing line. All in all, things went very well and we accomplished what we had set out to do.
