CALL OUTS:

- Two people were stranded on their vehicle in a wash at Ina Rd and the Santa Cruz River. 6-29-84 Twenty-two volunteers responded to the call escorting them out after the water subsided.
- Rendezvous for a missing 11-yr-old at Rose Canyon. Found before search ensued. 7-15-84
- Missing 13-yr-old girl last seen at Little Dam in Rose Canyon. Thirty people responded to the 7-22-84 call (135 total man hours) and found her about a 1/2 mile into Willow Canyon.

RIVER RESCUE PRACTICE Those who attended the river rescue training on Saturday were given an opportunity to participate and observe some very good training. First we were given a swift water rescue situation and told to write out a "game plan" for implementing our thoughts and ideas on rescuing the victims as quickly and safely as possible. This gave people a chance to really think and the papers turned in at the end of the session were very good. Next we had DPS Ranger 32 arrive for a joint training session. We were given an opportunity to view the helicopter and some of the new devices implemented for river rescue. We then set up a situation and DPS ferried people across the river in preparation for rescuing two victims stranded in the middle of the Santa Cruz River. It was thrilling for those who rode in the helicopter and they now know what to expect under actual conditions. DPS attempted to drop "PFD's" (life jackets) to our victims stranded in the wash. Two methods were used, 1) dropping the jackets from the helicopter, and 2) lowering the jackets by use of webbing. It was decided the latter method was best as it gave more control and less chance of the jacket being lost downstream. Finally with the DPS paramedic on the skid, they lowered the "horse collar" to one of the victims, who put it on and lifted him to the bank. This was an excellent practice for both groups. Our thanks go to DPS for a joint effort and an excellent training session.

A few items of general comment and safety tips:

- Please use extreme caution around the helicopter. Keep your head down when approaching or exiting the helicopter and keep within the pilot's sight at all times. (We have this on video tape!)
- A loud hailer would be preferable for DPS helicopter as well as all rescue vehicles.
- Perform a rigid safety check on all persons entering the water, i.e. life jacket, wet suit, communications, etc.
- Team of people to check water conditions by entering the water at a safe area to work their way toward the victims with a handline. Handline should be on a small reel.
