STOKES DERBY



MEDICAL AND FIELD SKILLS QUALIFICATIONS

Each SARA member is responsible that a current copy of their medical certification/or license and a copy of their current Field Skills Checkout card is in the SARA field qualification records. Currently Andy Lamb is updating the records and asking everyone to check that current copies are in the field qualification records which will be at the next several SARA meetings.

FIELD SKILLS QUALIFICATIONS

The SARA Board passed a policy in 1993 that requires all members to recertify their field skills every three years to stay field qualified. All field qualified members as of October 31, 1993 received a field skills qualification which expires on October 31, 1996. Many members have attended a field skills recertification since October 31, 1993 and have obtained a new field skills qualification. All other members are required to attend a field skills recertification before October 31, 1996 to stay field qualified.

Members who have not attended a field skills recertification will have four opportunities to attend in 1996. The recertification dates are January 27, April 27, July 27, and October 26. Please plan on attending a recertification on one of these dates. October is pumpkin time (DON'T BE ONE).

Note: Trainees receive a field qualification which is good for one year.

CALLOUT REVIEWS

Summary of Data

Reporting Period: 22 Nov - 30 Dec, 1995 Callouts: 6 SARCI People: 56 Total Hours: 208 Hrs/Person: 3.7

SAT 25 NOV: CALL 95.099 Rescue of a 50 year old male diabetic who was having problems on the Wilderness of Rocks Trail, Catalina Mountains. This call was initially paged as a medical emergency. The victim was about a half mile down the trail past Marshall Saddle. Mt. Lemmon Fire Department reached the patient and determined that he was exhausted but was fine otherwise. They started walking him out and shortly met the first SAR teams. The patient continued to walk out taking frequent rest stops. The patient was placed on a horse near Marshall Saddle and rode out of the field.

19 people, 76 hours, MLFD

TUE 28 NOV: CALL 95.100 Search for a group of four 60 year old hikers on the Box Camp Trail, Catalinas. The group was overdue on a hike to the Sabino Canyon Visitor's Center. While responding to the end of the tram road in Sabino Canyon, TJ met one of the hikers who said one of them was suffering from a sore knee and the group was progressing slow. TJ found the group near the top of the switchbacks. Other teams made it into the field and walked with them out of the field.

Rendezvous only.

WED 6 DEC: CALL 95.101 Search for a 42 year old male mentally challenged, diabetic who walked away from a group home in the Ina and LaCanada neighborhood. Paged as a dog search with the dogs starting to track from the residence. Several other teams were sent out in vehicles to look in the surrounding area. Nothing was found and the teams were sent home. A pair of SAV's on their way home located the subject near the Tohono Chul Park.

16 people, 66 hours, R38 SAV

SUN 17 DEC: CALL 95.102 Search for a 19 year old male with epilepsy overdue on a hike up Seven Falls Trail from the Sabino Canyon Visitor's Center. The subject was to return before sundown. TJ interviewed some hikers at the Visitor's Center who reported seeing the subject near the Bear Canyon and Sycamore Basin Trail junction (Lower Sycamore Saddle). Two hasty teams were sent up the trails, one up Sabino Canyon, the other up Seven Falls Trail. The Posse started in from the Prison Camp. Additional teams were sent up Sabino. The Sabino Canyon hasty team met the subject just short of Pine Creek crossing. He was OK, just ran out of daylight, got off trail and full of cactus, and was cold. The team warmed him up and walked him out of the field.

15 people, 51 hours, C511

THUR 21 DEC: CALL 95.103 Report of a 50 year old male with an ankle injury a mile up the trail in Madera Canyon, Santa Ritas. The person got out of the field before any teams left rendezvous. He had slipped on fresh snow a short way up the Super Trail.

Rendezvous only, RMFD

THUR 21 DEC: CALL 95.104 Search for a missing 4 year old boy from his home in the foothills of the Tucson Mountains. We were asked to help several patrol units, SAV volunteers, and Ranger 38. As we arrived at base camp, the boy was located sitting in a wash with his dog, not far from his house.
