

The course is offered to current members, persons planning on joining one of the SARCI component groups, or the Mount Lemmon Ski Patrol.

#### MEDICAL AND FIELD SKILLS OUALIFICATIONS

Each SARA member is responsible that a current copy of their medical certification/or license and a copy of their current Field Skills Checkout card is in the SARA field qualification records. Currently Andy Lamb is updating the records and asking everyone to check that current copies are in the field qualification records which will be at the next several SARA meetings. April 1, 1996 has been established as the "Drop Dead" date. After this date, if the records do not show a current field qualification, the SARA person will not be allowed to respond to callouts. Remember, only field-qualified members vote!

#### FIELD SKILLS QUALIFICATIONS

The SARA board passed a policy in 1993 that requires all members to recertify their field skills every three years to stay field qualified. All field qualified members as of October 31, 1993 received a field skills qualification which expires on October 31, 1996. Many members have attended a field skills recertification since October 31, 1993 and have obtained a new field skills qualification. All other members are require to attend a field skills recertification before October 31, 1996 to stay field qualified.

The members who have not attended a field skills recertification have three opportunities left 1996 to attend. The recertification dates are April 27, July 27, and October 26. Please plan on attending a recertification on one of these dates.

Note: Trainces receive a field qualification which is good for one year.

## CALLOUT REVIEWS

**Summary of Data** 

Reporting Period: 23 Dec 95 - 23 Jan 96 Callouts: 9
SARCI People: 135 Total Hours: 442 Hrs/Person: 3.3

MON 1 JAN: CALL 96.001 Search for 61 year old male diabetic, missing since noon from his residence south of Valencia, west almost to Ryan Field. He was last seen a mile from home, near a desert location used for target practice. Search teams arrived and were checking out the available information, when dogs barking behind the residence alerted people, who found the missing person wandering around disoriented, but in otherwise good condition.

18 people, 51 hours, R38

SUN 7 JAN: CALL 96.002 Rescue 2? year old male with a dislocated patella (knee cap) on the Pontatoc Ridge Trail, east of Finger Rock Canyon. The reportee stated that the victim had twisted his knee on the trail and had dislocated his patella. The victim was able to put the patella back into position but was having some discomfort. Teams almost zoomed past him, hobbling with assistance, almost a quarter-mile from the trailhead. He was examined, quick splinted, then carried out by stokes.

25 people, 43 hours, RMFD

TUE 9 JAN: CALL 96.003 Rescue of 60 year old male who had fainted on the Blackett's Ridge Trail, above the Phoneline Trail, in Sabino Canyon. The victim had been hiking with a hiking club and had fainted on the trail. Teams met him and his party moving comfortably downtrail, and accompanied them the rest of the way.

17 people, 21 hours, RMFD C510

SUN 14 JAN: CALL 96.004 The Posse was requested to assist in the large, ongoing search for a missing 8 year old girl from the south end of Tucson.

7 people, 43 hours

TUE 16 JAN: CALL 96.005 Body recovery, 100 meters up the trail from the end of the road on the Sabino Canyon Trail. A ?? year old male with a history of heart problems suffered a heart attack shortly after he started hiking up the trail. CPR was administered but was discontinued by a doctor on the scene.

16 people, 20 hours, RMFD C510

MON 15 JAN: CALL 96.006 The Posse was requested to assist in the large, ongoing search for a missing 8 year old girl from the south end of Tucson.

3 people, 19 hours

FRI 19 JAN: CALL 96.007 Rescue of a 26 year old male stranded by steep terrain and darkness, on the ridge between Bear Canyon and Sabino Canyon, about a half mile from the end of the road in Sabino Canyon and 1000' higher than the PhoneLine Trail. The 290 lb. victim hiked up the Seven Falls Trail with a friend and the pair decided to come over the ridge into Sabino Canyon. They separated, the victim tried to find his way down the slope, bare legs becoming well scratched, and tennis shoes contributing to twisting an ankle. He stayed put after dark, hollering to people at the trailhead. Ranger38 located him from the air (by reflective tape on his shoes), and helped find routes to him that avoided the main cliffs. It took several hours for the rescue teams to reach his location. He warmed quickly with

pants and jacket over T-shirt and shorts. His ankle was taped, and he was able to join the team traversing to a gully that was a less difficult way down than the way used to get up to the scene. Many other people assisted with finding a reasonable route down the slope. Spotlights from the road helped light up the nearby slope, providing orientation for teams heading for the scene (we found that the lights were very helpful as long as you weren't looking right towards them, and they were lighting up the adjacent slopes).

25 people, 131 hours, R38

SAT 20 JAN: CALL 96.008 Call to assist MLFD with a fall victim a quarter of a mile down the Aspen Trail from Marshal Gulch, Catalina Mountains. A delayed notification resulted in the victim being out of the field before lead teams were able to make it much pass rendezvous.

Rendezvous only.

FRI 26 JAN: CALL 96.009 Rescue of 60 year old female hiker, who had injured her ankle in Pima Canyon, 3 miles up trail at the "dam", a small retaining wall. She and her companion were pretty chilly by the time the reportee got out and we got up to her. The women were warmed by extra clothing, beverages, and a fire, which markedly improved their spirits. The evaluation of her injuries indicated that a mule ride could be attempted, much to the relief of the stokes team, having fun enough with an empty litter. Jasper provided an ample rear end, and Nick plenty to hang onto, and the group moved smoothly down the trail. The companion moved slowly down trail with another group, getting out almost an hour after Jasper & Co.

24 people, 114 hours.
