Search and rescue training was held at Alex Hodges' Ranch. We did a four hour refresher course with the help of SARA personnel on update of haul systems. For medical review and upgrades we went into long bone management and care. Thanks to Dr. Dave of the Posse for coming up with the latest in fiberglass splinting materials and the training for the use of those materials. Thanks to SARA for the big blue splint boot. Dan will have all the right stuff for transporting an ankle injury out by horse. We covered splinting for four solid hours along with refreshing primary-secondary surveys and scene management. Thanks to Frank Dearden for being very patient while we were splinting him 18-20 different times, using three different methods. Special thanks to Alex Hodges for a brilliant meal and hospitality.

Search and Rescue call out with horse transportation: Nacho and Dan hauled a 70-year old out of the switchbacks above Seven Falls. Once again proving a good horse sure saves alot of stokes hours. Nick & Charity did a transport of a body recovery out of a very, very deep canyon down in the Dragoon Mountains next to China Peak. Horse did fine, Nick did fine too, but looked a little peaked. It seems so far this year it's been quiet, then all of a sudden we're busy. Still need all the help we can get, Posse, S&R people.

The display at the fair did not go as planned. However, Frank Discorfano did hustle a horse and Simmons came up with enough spare tack to outfit it, even though the head stall didn't fit. Only Larry Cunningham will know the difference.

Oh yes, our captain Larry Caugh said the Arizona desert grows trees extremely quick. While Larry was training his mule a tree just grew up in front of him at which time Larry hit the tree, bruising his left shoulder and pulling muscles all the way down to his fingers. WED 26 MAR: CALL 97.009 Rescue of a ?? year old male with a broken ankle near the stream along the main trail at Tanque Verde Falls. The victim was carrying a cooler down the trail, missed a step and ended up twisting his ankle and falling. He was given a stokes ride to the road. 26 people, 35 hours

SAT 29 MAR: CALL 97.010 Search for a 10 year old autistic male in Bear Canyon, Catalina Hiway mp 10 and 11. This call came shortly after the Stokes derby at Tanque Verde Falls so a team from Cochise County joined us on the search. Just after teams got started in the field, Ranger 38 spotted one of the Mt. Lemmon deputies with the subject. 23 people, 52 hours, R38, CCSAR

SAT 29 MAR: CALL 97.011 Search for a 19 year old male overdue after being separated from friends near Soller's Point, Catalina Hiway mp 19. As teams where gathering near the Point Last Seen, the subject walked out to the road. 16 people, 32 hours

SAT 29 MAR: CALL 97.012 K-9 search for a 65 year old Alzheimer patient near Orange Grove and Shannon. She was picked up by a passerby and could only remember an out of town phone number. The subject was picked up by another daughter than the one who reported the subject missing. It was sorted out before any teams got into the field.. 7 people, 7 hours

SAT 05 APR: CALL 97.013 Search for a 42 year old female overdue from a hike the previous weekend. The search was started after USFS workers located her car near China Peak in the Dragoon Mtns. Cochise County requested our assistance first thing Saturday morning. A team located the subject's body at the base of a cliff which she had apparently fallen from. The body was carried out a short distance, then carried out by Nick's horse Charity.

12 people, 103 hours, Cochise SAR

SAT 05 APR: CALL 97.014 Rescue of a 70 year old female who slipped and hit the back of her head about 50 yards up the Sabino Canyon Trail at the end of the tram road. The ambulance crew walked her out without our help. 13 people, 13 hours

TUE 08 APR: CALL 97.015 Search for a 32 year old female suicide patient in Ventana Canyon. Family members hiked to Maiden Pools just after dark without finding her. TJ hiked up to the base of the switchbacks, not finding sign leading up-trail, and getting out about midnight. The family members started up a second time about one o'clock, and the patient responded to her mom's call, from near the stream about a half-mile up trail from the forest boundary. She was drowsy from having taken a number of pills, so they started carrying her piggy-back. TJ took over about a 1/4 mile up the trail. No others made it into the field.

WED 09 APR: CALL 97.016 Rescue of a 70 year old male with an isolated ankle injury at the top of the switchbacks above Seven Falls on the Bear Canyon Trail. He had hiked from the Visitor's Center, up the Phoneline and Sabino Canyon Trails to Pine Creek Crossing and down Bear Canyon before he slipped off trail and broke his ankle. The first team wrapped his ankle in a blanket and put a Sam splint around it, as was done two weeks before with a victim at the falls. The victim enjoyed a horse ride out to the trailhead.

THR 10 APR: CALL 97.017 Rescue of a ?? year old female with a wrist or arm injury on the Bluff Trail in Sabino Canyon. She was a couple of hundred yards down trail, and was carried out by stokes before many of us got into the field. 7 people, 7 hours

SAT 12 APR: CALL 97.018 Rescue of a 46 year old female with a tib/fib fracture of the lower left leg at Anderson Dam near the 8th stream crossing in Sabino Canyon. The Forest Service had the leg splinted and the victim was given a short ride in a stokes to the road.

11 people, 16 hours

SAT 19 APR: CALL 97.019 Rescue of a 66 year old female reported to be exhausted near Romero Pools above Catalina State Park. Ranger 38 soon located the victim a short distance above the old trailhead at the end of the dirt road, being assisted out of the field by Park Rangers. Ranger landed near by and flew the victim down to the parking lot. Only Jasper and Nick made it into the field.

4 people, 4 hours, R38, GRFD

SAT 26 APR CALL 97.020 Rescue of a 33 year old male hiker, with a Canyon Ranch group, about three miles up the Esperero Trail, just below "Cardiac Ridge" where the trail has climbed out of Bird Canyon ("Stone Fork") and has the first view of Esperero Canyon itself. He twisted his ankle and was unable to put any weight on it. Teams started in from Bird Canyon while Ranger 38 flew upcanyon to locate the scene. They were able to drop off one of the medics, who packaged the patient and made some room for the helicopter to get close to the ground. The hasty team arrived as the patient was picked up and flown to the Sabino helispot.
