A Fond Farewell to Kenny

For those of us who were involved in Search & Rescue back in the late 70's and early 80's, we were all better people for knowing and being around a young man, that despite his age, was always willing to help in any way he could, or to be a part of any search & rescue activity just so he would be involved with helping the community.

Kenny Parkhurst brought so much enthusiasm to the group that you couldn't help but be affected. He left the group several years ago to pursue other E.M.S. related career opportunities outside of Tucson. Sadly, on August 25th, 1997, Kenny's life came to an end, leaving behind not only his own family, but a family of friends he made during his time in search & rescue.

I met Kenny out at the Pima County Fair, at the S.A.R.A. booth. He was just getting involved with the group and I was with Pima County 4 Wheel Drive. We were both relatively young so it was easy to relate with one another. He would always show me his climbing gear, which got me interested in more of what S.A.R.A. did, and I would show him Burtha, which got him interested in four wheeling. From then on we did a lot of things together. We took climbing lessons together, and then we went out and rappelled off train bridges and freeway overpasses into the Santa Cruz River.

Kenny, Loma Griffith, and I all lived on the far southwest side of town. During monsoon storms the three of us would hop in Burtha and patrol the washes for stranded drivers. I got Kenny involved with the Drexel Heights Fire Dept. You couldn't keep him away from the station. The enthusiasm he showed for search & rescue was magnified 10 times at the fire department. He would always comment about doing what he always loved and now getting paid for it.

But just being a fireman wasn't enough for Kenny. He wanted to be a paramedic and fly on Ranger 29. So soon after finishing his fire training, he enrolled in a paramedic class. Kenny then left Tucson to be a paramedic in Yuma, then Prescott, and then finally in Flagstaff. He got his wish and started working for one of the helicopter medical services.

One thing is for sure, Kenny Parkhurst loved to help out the public, and in every line of work related to fire and emergency services, he gave it his all and did a great job. The memories of our times together will always remain with me.

Grand Canyon Clean-Up

DATE: Oct. 11 (Saturday), 0800 Hrs.

PLACE: South Rim, GCNP

We will be participating in a trash clean-up with AMC &

CAMRA. This clean-up will involve 200 foot rappels (usually less) with ascending required to get back up the rope. Vertically qualified personnel will be doing SRT (single rope technique, with no belay). Support personnel are welcome and can be used to help at the top.

We will all be camping out in the group site area (Mather

We will all be camping out in the group site area (Mather campground, Sage Loop) which will be staked out early by AMC. Since there is only room for a few vehicles at the actual campsite, we will be dropping off our gear and parking nearby at Babbit's Store. There will be a pot luck/ barbeque on Saturday night at Shoshone Point, a remote picnic area on the way to Cameron. Bring your own food, charcoal, and drinks.

SARA's plan is to go up Friday night and meet AMC at the Canyon, work Saturday, then return Sunday or whenever people want to.

Those who wish to go over the edge must be vertically qualified and must be able to demonstrate their abilities. Requirements are to be able to ascend and descend (with intermediate stops and tie-offs for trash collection) and be able to switch from ascenders to rappel device (and back again) on the rope (not standing on the ground - there may not be any!). There are usually some smaller drops which may be worked by those who are not as skilled at ascending, but you still need to qualify.

A practice session will be held prior to the event at the PCSO's training site on Rita Road just south of I-10: 09:00 - 12:00, Saturday the 4th. A distinguished (notorious?) panel of judges will be there to assess your skills and answer questions. If we are aware of your vertical qualifications from

past trips, your attendance may not be required, but please ask first. I have personally given my word to AMC that we will not drop anyone!

If you are interested in going, please call me and I will put you on the list. I will let the participants know when the training session will be as well as all other details as the time draws near.

CPR Required to be Field Qualified

The SARA Board last Spring established that SARA members must have a current CPR Card to be field qualified. The board set September 25, 1997 as the cutoff date for members to have a copy of their CPR card on file to be field qualified. Please send Andy Lamb a copy of your CPR card for the records.

BLS Course: CPR for the Professional Rescuer

Adult, infant and child CPR, one and two man rescuer, use of pocket resuscitation mask and bag valve mask. Red Cross certificate upon successful completion of course. Cost \$20. A pocket rescue mask is required (\$11.00 at class). Time and place to be arranged: call Frances Walker, 790-9399

CPR Classes

In addition to Frances' class, many more are available through the Red Cross at 318-6740, and the American Heart Association has a CPR phone number at 795-1486 with a message listing a number of agencies and phone numbers. Note that we require a professional course that includes both one and two-person procedures.

For example, classes are given most Tuesday evenings at the Education Building at Tucson Medical Center. Call 324-2210 to reserve a \$15 seat. Classes may only have a half-dozen people, others may have twice that, but plenty of instructors and evaluators are available for the larger classes.

SAT 06 SEP CALL 97.044 The body of a male was reported to the Forest Service, and assistance was requested to move the body to the Control Road, a mile or two above the Oracle Ridge Mine. By the time people arrived at rendezvous, the assistance needed was evaluated to be minimal, and we were not needed. Rendezvous Only, MLFD

WED 08 SEP CALL 97.045 Rescue of a ?? year old male hiker near Seven Falls in Bear Canyon. The hiker with a companion had hiked from the end of the road in Sabino up to Pine Creek Crossing then intended to hike the East Fork and come down Bear Canyon past Seven Falls and out to the trail head. But they lost the trail in Bear Canyon before it drops to the stream. One individual was getting pretty exhausted, and was able to make a call with their cell phone which allowed T.J. to talk to them and asset the situation. Teams were able to hike in and found the pair above the switchbacks past the 7th stream crossing. After giving the hikers some water and rest, the team assisted them down and across the stream crossing where Nacho gave him a ride the rest of the way.


10 people, 18 hours

FRI 10 SEP CALL 97.046 Rescue of a ?? year old hiker complaining of sore hips on the Green Mountain Trail above General Hitchcock Campground. Initially the hiker was estimated to be over a mile up trail. By the time teams made it into the field the hiker was about a quarter of a mile up the trail. Paramedics had already made it to the scene. The patient rode the rest of the way in the stokes basket 5 people, 10 hours, MLFD, Kords

SUN 14 SEP CALL 97.047 Search for a 40 year old, mentally challenged male, missing near Hickiwan, on the Tohono O'Odham Nation about 20 miles east of Ajo. At some time in the morning a vehicle in which the subject was riding, was involved in a collision near Hickiwan, about 12 miles north of the Ajo Highway. While the occupants waited for the scene to be cleared, the person innocently asked which way was home. A companion pointed off through the desert to the south towards San Simon, about 10 miles away on the Ajo Highway. Shortly afterwards, the companions realized that the subject was missing, and tracks were found heading towards home. A search began, following the tracks. Ranger 38 joined the search in the late morning, and we were requested in the early afternoon. As we arrived in San Simon, our assignment was to cut for sign to the north, as the searchers were getting close. The subject was located nearby shortly afterwards, before we got into the field.

As we arrived, Dan McPhedran broke an engine belt. As we passed word back to town about the find, a request was made for parts. Jerry Simmons promptly responded (as promptly as you can from 100 miles away), only to discover that the real problem was a water pump. In the morning, they looked for parts in Ajo, then in Gila Bend, and finally hollered back to Tucson. T.J. promptly scooted out with more parts and all were back in town somewhat belatedly.
