

SUN 03 MAY CALL 98.038 K-9 search for a 4 year old female missing from a residence near Ruthrauff and La Cholla. The little girl was found at another residence shortly after the search started. 8 people, 8 hours

SUN 10 MAY CALL 98.039 Rescue of a ?? hiker with a knee injury on Finger Rock Trail near Linda Vista Saddle. Ranger 38 was able to land nearby and pick up the hiker. 11 people, 11 hours, R38

MON 11 MAY CALL 98.040 Rescue of a 40 year old female hiker with a broken ankle 2.5 miles up the Finger Rock Trail below the cliffs on the right side of the canyon. Teams made it to the scene and treated her ankle. The patient was carried by stokes up trail 200 yards to AirCare 1 who found a place to land right on trail. 15 people, 80 hours, AirCare 1

SAT 16 MAY CALL 98.041 Rescue of a ?? year old male climber at Windy Point. During SARA's monthly training a person reported that a climber had taken a fall and broken his leg. SARA responded quickly, and when the first team arrived on scene the patient refused treatment. The patient did not break his leg and was determined to walk out. 15 people, 15 hours

SAT 16 MAY CALL 98.042 Rescue of a 23 year old female suffering an asthma attack on the Butterfly Trail near Novio Spring. The patient was hiking with her mother and boyfriend when the asthma attack started. They called 911 by cell phone. A Boy Scout troop from Mesa came upon the scene and assisted the patient. Their cell phone was used after the mother's cell phone battery died. The scouts made a litter out of branches and a sleeping bag. They were able to carry the patient a short distance. Mt. Lemmon Fire Dept. Paramedic and EMT arrived first, and started her on oxygen and meds. The patient was quickly loaded when the stokes arrived and headed to a clearing about a half mile up trail. Additional oxygen was brought into the field as the oxygen canisters didn't last too long. Ranger 38 short hauled her from the clearing to the helispot at Soller's Point. AirCare 1 transported her from Soller's to the hospital. 8 people, 48 hours, R38, AirCare 1

SUN 24 MAY CALL 98.043 Search for three missing children, 11 & 12 years old, on the Box Camp Trail a half hour from the milepost 23 trailhead. The parents reported them missing on a day hike. TJ started into the field as SARA members responded. Yelling was heard from the direction of Spencer Canyon, and the children were shortly found. Their father was found soon after that. 17 people, 22 hours, R38

MON 25 MAY NO CALL Search for a missing ?? child from Rose Canyon Lake. Shortly after we were notified

the child was found by his parents.

WED 27 MAY CALL 98.044 Rescue of 18 year old rappeller on the Beaver Wall at Windy Point. A long ponytail was eaten by his "Rescue 8", stranding him for two hours, 60' above the ground on a 100' rappel. A rescuer was lowered on two ropes, then attached one to the victim. A 2-to-1 haul system lifted the second rope, and with some difficulty the victim was freed from his problem and both were lowered to the ground. The pony-tail became a souvenir. 14 people, 39 hours, MLFD, Ranger38

FRI 29 MAY CALL 98.045 Search for five kids missing from the Marshall Gulch area, ages 8 to 17. Ranger 38 spotted the five together in the bottom of Sabino Canyon, below the gauging station. Deputy Scott escorted them out, with help from search people bringing munchies, water, warmies, and lights. The kids had been last seen about 1pm, and reported seeing a trail sign for Box Spring, so they covered some country. They were tired, and starting to hurt. 13 people, 29 hours, Ranger38
