ORIENTATION HIKE REVIEW Josephine Saddle, Santa Rita Mountains

SARA's November 15th orientation hike to Josephine Saddle marked the 40th anniversary of a tragic event which powerfully changed the shape of Southern Arizona Rescue Association in its earliest days and also marked the lives of a number of members still active with the group today.

On that November weekend in 1958, a Boy Scout day hike up Mt. Wrightson was cut short by a sudden and severe snowstorm that left three boys dead. A foot of snow fell on the streets of Tucson that night, staying on the ground during the next three days of bitter cold. While the majority of the troop had decided to give up the hike and return to their cars as the snow started to fall, three of the boys, two of whom were celebrating their birthdays, chose to push on to reach the summit. The remains of a small fire on the trail near the upper saddle suggested that they got that far. However, they failed to return to the parking lot by evening, and their anxious friends went out for help. The search for the boys got under way in extremely severe weather conditions, was carried out by groups and individuals minimally equipped and organized. It was weeks before their remains were found down a steep slope below the trail leading southeast (away from the parking lot) out of Josephine Saddle.

Twenty of us, young and less so, turned out in amazing summery weather to remember that day and to share our memories of where we were that weekend and how the event changed our lives. Tom Harlan was one of the three college students who were the first to reach the cabin in Baldy Saddle, where their drinking water froze during the night within a foot of the stove, and then to push on through the deep snow to the summit to check the minimal shelter offered by the platform at the top. He joined SARA with the next training class. Marvin Stafford was a boy scout called out with his troop to help guide rescuers past the SARA-manned roadblock in the valley up the snowbound road to base camp at the Santa Rita Lodge. Clair Dietering was the boys' mailman in town who had known all three youngsters and who joined up with SARA the following year because of their deaths. Richard Kunz remembered playing in the snow in town that weekend and later the many hikes he took with his scout troop up the same trail.

A memorial marker in Josephine Saddle decorated with flowers pine cones and toys commemorates the boys' deaths and gives their ages; coincidentally and most poignantly for me they closely match the ages of the three youngest hikers romping around in our group: 12, 13 and 16. Our sincere thanks to Tom, Clair and Marvin for bringing an important chapter in SARA's history to life for us so beautifully.

Come learn the basics of ascending and descending ropes safely. The Wednesday night class will cover harnesses, repel devices and ascending systems. There are many ways to skin the cat (i.e., to set up a functional system) and so we will cover the basic configurations and when one system might be better than another. We will also spend time on procedures, safety and how to stay alive. And no discussion of vertical work would be complete without discussing emergency procedures.

The Saturday class will allow you to practice what you learned in the classroom session. The purpose of this class is to allow you to try out and compare several systems, help you set up a new system or adjust your existing system.

Please note that these two classes are only an introduction to vertical work. You should continue to train with supervision until you have received a high lever of proficiency.

SUN 15 NOV CALL 98.093 Search for two overdue hikers on the Finger Rock Trail. They were with a group that started up the trail in the morning planning to hike to Mt. Kimball, and were last seen around 11:00 am below Linda Vista. The rest of the group made it to Mt. Kimball and back to the trailhead but did not see the other two on trail. Ranger 38 responded as a team of four started up trail and got a voice response before the spring. The two were located at the second switchback above the spring.

SUN 22 OCT CALL 98.094 Three 19 year old male mountain bikers called on their cell phone reporting that they were caught by nightfall on the Samaniego Ridge Trail without any lights or warm clothing. Ranger 38 located them but due to the terrain and night conditions were unable to land. Ranger was able to get GPS coordinates of their location, then a care package with lights and warm clothes was dropped to them. Two teams started down the trail from the top. The first team located the three beside a campfire which the bicyclists were able to start with matches from the care package. The three were located within 0.03 miles of the GPS coordinates the Ranger had given and were about 1.5 miles north of Shovel Springs on trail. The three hiked back to the top with their bicycles and the search teams.
