ANNUAL MEETING and ELECTIONS

The Annual Meeting of the Southern Arizona Rescue Association will be held Friday, April 02 at 20:00. The Annual Meeting is being held at a new location, the SARA House on Craycroft Road. This is the first meeting to be held at the property that Pima County is in the process of making available to SARA. Plan on attending. We will kick off the evening with a pot luck starting at 18:30. Please bring a dish to share. SARA will provide the place setting and soft drinks.

The primary purpose of the annual meeting is the election of the board of directors for the next year. To be eligible to vote you must be a field qualified full member. Candidates and trainees are not eligible to vote.

SARA HOUSE

A lot of hard work by many people has resulted in a place to call our own, thanks to the Pima County Board of Supervisors. Floods in 1983 washed away a portion of the property, Pima County acquired the rest including the residence, and is developing access to the River Park.

The building is accessible by dirt roads from Craycroft just north of the Rillito, Tanque Verde, Pantano bridge, and from River Road just west of the Craycroft intersection. Both roads drop steeply just off the main road.

There is a center lane for left turns on Craycroft, so access is fine for both arriving and leaving from the north or south. Please limit River Road access to right-turns only. Please do not turn left into the area, or turn left when leaving, since River Road is only two lanes, is close to the Craycroft intersection, and the entrance is a steep dirt road. And please limit your speed to 25 mph and perhaps only 15 mph to minimize dust and noise.

We expect many activities to use the building, including other SARCI groups, so scheduling will be needed, especially if your activity is not included in the newsletter.

The parking is unorganized, but there is lots of room if we're careful.

We will do about 45-60 minute ground school regarding SARA's role in a helicopter mission, including proper use of the radios, landing information to relay to the crew, and SARA equipment used for such missions.

About 10:00 DPS will meet us at the helispot and do an inservice, and we are hoping to do a mock short haul (but that is still to be determined).

This will serve as a safety briefing and further exposure to helicopter work for those new in the group and a refresher for those candidates/members who have already worked around the helicopter.

In the months to come we will be forming an Ingress/ Egress training class for those who qualify, but this training may hold over your appetite until then!

This training will take a full day, so pack a lunch. People entering the cave will have a helmet, 3 sources of light (one helmet mounted), extra batteries for each source, boots, gloves, water in a non-breakable container, and something durable to carry everything in (fanny pack). Knee and elbow pads will make it more enjoyable, and you want to wear clothes that you don't plan on wearing again until the next time you go caving. Along that vein, a change of clothes for afterwards would be greatly appreciated by whatever vehicle you are riding home in.

Both in-cave and above-ground personnel will be required for this training, so don't miss out just because you're a little claustrophobic or don't like crawling around in the dark. SARA personnel will be camping out Friday night, if you want to come out and join the fun. (Yes, you can cave at night!)

FIELD SKILLS RECERTIFICATION: Don't Let It Lapse

To participate on Search and Rescue callouts, SARA members must be field qualified. Currently, field qualified members must have a current medical certificate, a current CPR card, and a current field skills qualification.

Members get their field skills qualification by successfully completing the Basic IV Field Checkout. The initial certification is good for one year. If you are a Full Member when you recertify your field skills qualification is good for three years. If you are not a Full Member (i.e. candidate or trainee) when you recertify your field skills qualification is good for one year.

If you let your field skills qualification lapse you are required to complete basic training again. We are only having one candidate class a year, so it may take as long as 23 months to get your field skills qualification back. Don't let this happen to you. The next recertification is Saturday, April 24.

Note: The Cave Creek crossing may cause problems for cars with low clearance. You will need to ARRIVE at Cave Creek between 9am and 11am. Camping is permitted at the meet site on Saturday night, but it is a primitive site with no facilities.
