**River Rescue** 

<u>Site:</u> Gila River near Winkleman <u>Meet:</u> 08:00, Sat July 17, Oracle and Magee Trainer: Bill Graff

You must complete a pool session at least once every three years to enter the river during this practice. You must provide your own wet suit and PFD, type 3 or 5, for this practice. Wet suits may be rented at one of the local dive shops.

Pool sessions are tentatively scheduled from 18:00 to 19:00, July 10 and 11, at Jacob's Park on Fairview between Prince and Miracle Mile. If you cannot make it to a pool session contact me and we will schedule a time to meet at the pool at Dennis Weaver Park.

The river practice will consist of reading the river, swimming the river and crossing techniques. Ranger 38 may show up to practice pick-ups. The practice takes up most of the day so bring a lunch.

#### TECHNICAL NEWS

#### from S.A.R.A.'s Technical Committee

S.A.R.A.'s rappel racks have been modified to make them easier and safer to use. The top bar has been pinned so that the bars stay on the correct side of the rack. The big bar is now the second bar down from the top. Additionally, reflective tape has been added to the bars so that it is easier to thread the rope correctly. When properly threaded, the rope should not run on the tape – the tape should be visible on every bar. Check them out!

The committee has spotted some potential problems on rescues of late. We have seen some carabiners with unlocked gates on the haul systems. We have also had to completely assemble the advantage plates because they weren't packed "ready to go". Also, we sometimes have to dump out a rope bag to get to the end of a rope that was stuffed with both ends at the bottom of the bag. Please keep the following in mind:

- 1. All carabiner gates must be locked in use. The gates must be facing away from the ground or any object that may force them open. The screw locking device must be tightened and the gates checked by trying to open them. The locking device must also be oriented so that the device tightens downhill. This will make it harder for vibration to unlock the gate – it's the gravity of the situation. This is what the expression "GATES DOWN AND OUT" means.
- 2. When the tech kits are packed, the advantage plates must be packed with the carabiners and pulleys attached as they would be in a "5 to 1" system. This makes it much faster to set up on a rescue. If you are packing after a training or rescue and don't know how to do this, please ask.
- 3. When stuffing the 600-foot rope bags, one of the rope halves must be packed so that the end feeds from the top. Always check the first bag, which is stuffed with the end on the bottom, and then pack the second bag with the middle of the rope at the bottom. It takes valuable time and some space to dump 300 feet of rope on the ground when both bags are packed rope end first.

There is still some confusion regarding screamers and where in the system to put them. <u>They should be used at the stokes</u> <u>only</u>. That goes for the belay attachment as well as the haul line attachment. Remember to use them in tandem (parallel) for each attachment.

Last, the dynamometer should be used in every haul system, unless we have to go a long way into the field. Remember that the setting needle must be used to set the max indicator needle "low scale", then moved "high scale" so it is out of the way, otherwise it can prevent an accurate maximum reading.

WED 02 JUN CALL 99.??? Search for a 51 year old female and a 53 year old male overdue on a picnic on Saturday May 29. The couple had planned a picnic for their third date. She was reported missing Sunday morning. The two had met on the Tucson Singles Line, and all that was known about him was that his name was Bob and he lived in Sierra Vista. Her vehicle was not found, and it took several days to determine his identity. We were called after the male's vehicle was located at noon, at the Palisades Trailhead. Teams covered the trails that leave from the parking lot since there was no known itinerary. Ranger 38 also flew the trails without success. After dark a light was seen to the north which appeared to be a campfire so R38 was asked to take a look. They found that the light was at or near a building north of the search area. On the way back R38 did spot a campfire low in Edgar Canyon, noting that there was at least one person who did not appear to be attracting attention, and the camp was adjacent to pools in the stream bottom. It would be light by the time a team could get to the camp from the top or bottom, so R38 would check at first light. Everyone was out of the field about midnight.

THU 03 JUN CALL 99.??? Continuation of the search for the two hikers. Ranger 38 located a single male hiker with near the campsite, but again he did not attract attention. Several trails were checked, and R38 flew the trails again but did not find anything. A tracking team started down the Davis Spring Trail from the Butterfly Trail, and picked up bits and pieces of track about a mile downtrail that looked appropriate for the missing pair. R38 concentrated on Atchley Canyon, running north into Alder Canyon, and spotted the female about 2 miles down canyon. They landed nearby and flew the dehydrated hiker to TMC, where T.J. interviewed her. Her description of her companion, whom she last saw Sunday morning, matched the hiker R38 had spotted in Edgar Canyon. R38 located him again in the same area, a couple of miles east of the tracking team. R38 flew him out, then picked up the tracking team (can YOU get smoothly into the helicopter at a four-foot hover, with your pack?).
