Voice Pagers

Those of you that have voice pagers that work, count your blessings. But when they have problems, don't expect them to get fixed without a lot of aggravation (so that they work again). That sums up our recent experience.

Alpha pagers now cost about the same as the voice pagers, and digital pagers run much less. Add voice mail and make your pager more flexible. Pay by the year and save more. Alpha pagers receive numeric pages just like the digital pagers. Alphanumeric pages (text) can be sent from a special console (rented), from a pager program on a computer, from a web page, or best of all from an email message.

If the soldier could not make it, they would return to lead the medic to them.

SEPTEMBER TRAININGS Tracking Training

When: 09:00, Saturday, September 18

Where: SAR House

Bring your callout pack, and wear a pair of boots with an interesting tread pattern. Learn some interesting tricks to tracking, a much needed skill in the field.

Helicopter Hover Ingress/Egress

When: 08:00, Sunday, September 19

Meet: Circle K, Tanque Verde east of Tanque Verde Loop.

Where: Redington Pass at the cattle pens (milepost 7.5)

Ingress/egress training with the helicopter flying at a low hover of 1' to 3'. A smooth transition of your weight from the ground to the helicopter is needed. Bring your pack, and be prepared for a cross-country hike of several miles. Helmet and goggles are required, earplugs are recommended.

This is not introductory training. Participants are expected to have had a helicopter orientation with Ranger 38, and be familiar with procedures for entering, seating, and exiting the aircraft with packs. Other people are welcome to observe.

OCTOBER TRAINING Advanced Map & Compass Training

<u>Meet</u>: Houghton & Irvington (Pima County Maint.Shop) <u>Where</u>: Rosemont Junction / Greaterville (off Sonoita Hwy.)

This training will be targeted primarily for intermediate and advanced map-readers to practice and work on map and compass skills. The Posse is welcomed and encouraged to attend. The distances covered will be longer than a typical orienteering event, so it will therefore be much like a realistic search. It is also a great opportunity to practice with your GPS if you have one.

We will begin with an intermediate/advanced class that will focus on map-reading techniques and terrain identification. We will also discuss cross-country route selection strategies and lost-prevention. After the class, each person will be given a map of the area. There will be a several remote destinations marked on the map for you to find using only map and compass (and/or GPS). Expect to be on foot (or horse) anywhere from three to six hours, your choice. You may go out individually or with a partner. Everyone should have full SARA search pack, especially compass and whistle. Also bring GPS and ham radio if you have them.

Candidates and members who have less-than-intermediate map skills are encouraged to participate and team up with another member. You are especially encouraged to attend the orienteering event the weekend of September18-19 in the Dragoon Mountains. It will have a beginner's class and courses for all skill-levels. (See notice elsewhere in this newsletter).

HIKE OF THE MONTH REVIEW August: Box Camp Trail

The Box Camp Trailhead is high in the Catalinas, but it was already warm as we started around 9am. On the way to the Box Camp / Box Spring Trail junction, we visited overlooks into upper and middle Sabino Canyon (find the Butterfly/"H" shaped contour line on the topo map). The old lookout is a great place to hone your map and compass skills when identifying the landmarks around you.

The Box Spring Trail goes thru a saddle above the spring, where a steep trail-of-use heads toward Brinkley Point, passing the Dragon's Tail overlook. From an earlier search I knew we would find a good rest spot: a hammock! We found that it was big and strong enough for all four of us while we continued our map orientation (maps - held overhead – provide great shade when lying down!). We easily found the Dragon's Tail, which looks into most of upper Sabino Canyon. Towering cumulus clouds persuaded us to stroll back to the parking lot.

SUN 02 AUG CALL 99.064 Divers' Call, I-10 Frontage Road and the Rillito. A pickup was discovered upside down in a pool of water. 2 bodies were recovered from the pickup after it was pulled from the water.

8 people, 36 hours

MON 03 AUG CALL 99.065 Search for two 18 year old female hikers overdue on a hike to Romero Pools. They apparently walked down Montrose Canyon and were picked up near the contact station. No volunteers made it into the field.

7 people, 7 hours

FRI 06 AUG CALL 99.066 Dog search in the area of I-19 and Ajo.

5 people, 17 hours

SAT 07 AUG CALL 99.067 Search for a 15 year old male hiker whose companions hiked ahead to Romero Pools. Not knowing that he past the pools, he continued up trail and was found in the morning near Romero Spring.

11 people, 57 hours

SUN 08 AUG CALL 99.068 Divers evidence search, Santa Cruz River.

7 people, 28 hours

SUN 08 AUG CALL 99.069 Rescue of a 22 year old male fall victim at 7 Falls. Ranger 38 landed at the base of the falls, then ferried a team of volunteers to help carry the patient on a backboard to the helicopter.

21 people, 35 hours

THR 12 AUG CALL 99.070 Search for a 84 year old male missing from his residence in Green Valley. He suffers from the early stages of Alzheimer's. Tracks were found crossing a road, railroad tracks and fence into a open area near mine tailings northwest of the residence.

19 people, 101 hours

FRI 13 AUG CALL 99.071 Continuation of the search. He was spotted at the base of the tailings by Ranger 38.

5 people, 12 hours

SAT 14 AUG CALL 99.072 Exhausted ?? year old male hiker on the Mt Lemmon Trail. He called by cellphone, three miles from the trailhead, very tired and wet. TJ drove down the top of the trail and found him just after the Lemmon Rock junction. Rendezvous only.

0 people, 0 hours

MON 16 AUG CALL 99.073 Rescue of a ?? year old female with an ankle injury at the third stream crossing on the 7-Falls trail. She was carried by stokes to the trailhead.

10 people, 20 hours

MON 16 AUG CALL 99.074 Search for a 25 year old male hiker down the Box Camp Trail to the Sabino Canyon Visitor's Center. Pine Creek Crossing and Hutchs' Pool were checked without sign of the hiker.

7 people, 41 hours

TUE 17 AUG CALL 99.075 Continuation of search. While teams rechecked trails and junctions in the morning, the subject walked to the Visitor's Center. He had not planned to hike the route reported by his companions, but hiked to Romero Pass, then over to Esperero Canyon where he spent the night and walked out in the morning.

11 people, 52 hours

FRI 20 AUG CALL 99.076 Rescue of a 30 year old female who fell from the trail near the base of the switchbacks on the 7-Falls Trail. She was complained of back and neck pain. She was backboarded and LifeNet 4 landed on the rock in the streambed, then flew her to the hospital.

12 people, 38 hours

SAT 21 AUG CALL 99.077 Rescue of a 15 year old female complaining of lower back pain after jumping 30' into Romero Pools. She was carried on backboard to LifeNet 2.

20 people, 97 hours

SUN 22 AUG CALL 99.078 Cochise County requested our help with a search east of Sierra Vista for a 56 year old male whose car was discovered near the San Pedro River. The subject walked into basecamp just after our teams arrived.
