This year we will use Rescue Randy for our victim and plan many cycles of raising and lowering the victim to get as many rescuers as possible to try their hand at being the Stokes basket attendant. We need many people to attend this training to make it successful. Bring a lunch because the training will not finish until mid afternoon. I encourage all candidates to attend this training so you can see first hand what is involved in a technical rescue. You DO NOT NEED A SEAT HARNESS or other personal technical rescue equipment to attend this training but be sure to bring your rescue pack and helmet. At the classroom session we will go over the basics of raising and lowering of the Stokes basket. We will also cover attendant attachment and effective positioning.

TUE 04 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours Ranger 38

Search for a 10 year old female at Rose Canyon Lake. Ranger 38 spotted her just before sunset in Sycamore Canyon about a mile below the junction with Rose Canyon. Teams eventually made it to her and returned to Rose Canyon Lake.

SAT 08 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours MLFD, RMFD, Ranger 38

Rescue of a 25 year male climber at Ridgeline near Catalina Highway, milepost 18.5. The patient fell while climbing and his belayer could not hold him. He sustained an open fracture of his right ankle. His ankle was splinted and carried by Stokes basket out of the field, with a 300' lower system for the final slope to the highway. Ranger flew him out from Soller's Point.

SUN 09 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours

Rescue of two exhausted hikers on the Butterfly Trail near the Davis Springs Trail junction. The female arrived at Palisades as rescue people arrived. The Mt. Lemmon deputy met the male on trail, and volunteers soon joined them. Meanwhile, a boy was missing from another group of hikers and we assisted reuniting them. Yet another hiker arrived, having separated from his group and bushwhacking to the road. He rejoined his party before another missing person was reported.

TUE 11 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours

Rescue of a 39 year old male hiker exhausted on the Esperero Trail at the Mt. Miguel Saddle. The group hiked up Ventana Canyon, then decided to come back down Esperero Trail. The subject became exhausted near Mt. Miguel Saddle and they requested help by cell phone. Teams hiked in with food and water and met the group near the bottom of the switchbacks below the saddle. The patient was able to hike out on his own.

THU 20 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours

Rescue of an ill hiker reported to be three quarters of the way to Romero Pools. Deputy Doug met the hiker and companion at the bighorn sheep sign a short distance from the end of the road. The patient was able to hike out with no assistance.

SUN 23 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours RMFD, Ranger 38

Rescue of a 25 year old male fall victim at Tanque Verde Falls. The patient slipped while walking near the second Turkey Pool and tumbled about 20 feet into the water. He made it to the edge of the pool but was complaining of a hip injury. RMFD paramedics were the first on scene with Ranger 38 overhead. The patient was hauled up the Turkey Chute, then carried to Ranger 38 for a ride to TMC.

SAT 29 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours Ranger 38

Rescue of two riders and their horses in the hills east of Soldier's Trail. The horses became exhausted in the heat of the day, and the riders were running low on water as well. They weren't really sure of their location as we talked to them on cellphone. Teams started in from several directions. Ranger 38 flew water in and carried the riders out while field teams worked with the horses. A severe thunderstorm cooled everyone down, but lightning complicated the call. Some equipment was dumped and everyone made it out after dark. The Posse retrieved the remaining equipment in the morning.

SUN 30 JUL CALL 2000.0 0 people 0 hours Ranger 38

Standby for an injured motorcyclist with a leg injury reported to be on the Chute Route to Chivo Falls, about 1 or 2 miles from the Chute. Ranger 38 quickly located the scene just over a mile in, near Chivo Tank. A vehicle with four people had stopped to assist the rider. The group packaged the patient and within fifteen minutes Ranger was enroute to TMC.
