

The Scenario: A reportee has indicated that he came upon an apparent victim in the University of Arizona's San Xavier Mine. The mining students have been away for several weeks and, according to the University, no one is known to have been on the site. The reportee was in the area and found the steel doors to the main adit ajar and began exploring the mine on a lark. Upon discovering the victim he ran from the scene and left the area. He called 911 in an attempt to anonymously report his findings. According to the deputy (who had just returned from another fishing trip) the victim was seen near a vertical shaft - the reportee remembers seeing light coming down the shaft, but did not proceed further. The reportee had been wandering around in the mine for "a couple of hours" prior to observing the victim. Bolting from the scene, the reportee is unsure of where exactly the victim was, since he was unsure of his

location. He only recalls sketchy details of his exit that took him through a tunnel and up a tortuous ladder-lined passage that deposited him on the level of the adit upon which he first entered the mine.

SARA has been requested to search the mine and, if the reportee is correct, recover the body of the victim. A map exists for the mine. The mine consists of a vertical shaft which accesses two levels assuming the flooring closing off a third level is intact. Individuals should be prepared to descend via this route. A manway connects one of these levels with the main drift or adit. The ventilation system is inoperable.

The Training: Please be prepared to depart (vehicles gassed up, carpools formed, doughnuts bought, equipment loaded) rendezvous by 07:40 since the site is twenty minutes away. At the site a brief orientation about the mine and mine safety will be presented prior to beginning the exercise. In order to expose the largest number of people to the different aspects of the operation, I would ask that those with experience participate as team members rather than as team leaders.

The Objective: This training is primarily to hone the skills associated with confined space rescue in an area with less stable ground than a cave. The secondary objective is to gain experience in team and leadership positions, problem solving and tasks that one may not have had frequent opportunity to participate in at an actual operation, e.g. team leader, rigging systems, victim packaging and handling.

Best estimate is that the training will end around noon with a group discussion and debriefing. See you there!
