

#### **February Training: Winter Survival**

SARA's first annual Winter Survival Training course is intended as an introduction to winter survival for search and rescue personnel operating in Arizona. The class will emphasize information and techniques that enhance personal survival and field effectiveness under winter conditions found in Arizona. Hard-core winter mountaineering subjects such as glacier travel, ice climbing, and 8000 meter operations are not the focus of the course. The course is open to all SARCI members and candidates as well as law enforcement personnel. No prior experience or training is required, inexperienced personnel should attend. Participants should bring backpackable winter overnight camping equipment (sleeping bag, bivvy sack, layered warm clothes, waterproof shoes, food, etc.) to the field session and be prepared to spend Saturday night in the field on top of Mt. Lemmon, 0.5 to 2 miles from the trailhead depending on conditions. Classroom session will cover equipment needs in detail. Loaner equipment is available for those who have not - contact Henry Jacobs. Specialized equipment (crampons, ice axe, etc.) will be provided and is not required.

#### **Baboquivari Hike and Climb**

The SARA Trail Familiarity hiking group has scheduled a hike and climb on Baboquivari Peak. This hike and climb is open to anyone who would like to participate. Marvin Stafford, who has climbed Baboquivari over 30 times, will act as our guide on the mountain. The basic plan is to start very early on Saturday morning so we can get one climb in before camping on the mountain Saturday night. Sunday will be a more leisurely day of hiking, exploring and getting home before dark. If you plan to stay on the mountain overnight, bring your winter overnight camping gear and supplies (expect cold weather!).

If you want to do the climb, in addition to your winter overnight camping gear you'll also need your hard hat, head-mounted light, seat harness (even if improvised from webbing), independent rappel apparatus and locking carabiners. Those who are planning to do some of the lead climbing will have to bring ropes, slings and extra carabiners. When we finally know how many climbers we have, we will decide just how many ropes to take.

Also, for anyone interested, on Sunday, Jan 7, we'll take a day trip to Baboquivari to pre-position some gear there to make the logistics of trip the following weekend a little easier. Hiking but no technical climbing is anticipated for this day trip.

**SAT 25 NOV** CALL 2000.083 14 people 24 hours Ranger 38, Medic 65

A hiker twisted his ankle near the last stream crossing below Seven Falls in Bear Canyon. He gimped his way down trail, and rode a horse the rest of the way out.

**WED 29 NOV** CALL 2000.084 5 people 14 hours Air 1, TPD

Evidence Search for human remains in a desert area. The helicopter found the scene before anyone got into the field.

WED 29 NOV CALL 2000.085 4 people 20 hours TPD

The previous search area was used for training after the scene had been investigated. A second body was found close to the first scene, partly obscured by debris and vegetation.

**THU 30 NOV** CALL 2000.086 25 people 106 hours

Search people were requested to cover the area around the previous two scenes, looking for any additional evidence. Several canine teams, a horse team, and a couple of large foot teams spent several hours in the area.

MON 04 DEC CALL 2000.087 4 people 24 hours SCSO

A hunter found a human skull near Lochiel, near the Sonora border in Santa Cruz County. Canine teams were requested to search for additional human remains in the area. One bone, possibly human, was found.

**SAT 16 DEC** CALL 2000.088 13 people 130 hours SCSO Canine teams provided additional coverage in the previous search area.

**SUN 17 DEC** CALL 2000.089 17 people 17 hours

A female hiker injured her ankle in Molino Canyon, reported to be a mile or two up trail. She was about a mile from the entrance to the Molino Campground, but a very short distance from the end of the paved road. Nobody got into the field.

WED 20 DEC CALL 2000.090 5 people 28 hours Ranger 38, SAV

An 83 year old male with Alzheimer's was missing in Green Valley. SAV people were covering the residential area, and canine teams were requested when the nearby desert area needed attention. There was about a half mile of flat desert to the base of mine tailings, but well protected by typical less-than-friendly natural vegetation. The subject was found in good condition a couple of miles further west along a road by a mine security patrol.

**SUN 24 DEC** CALL 2000.091 19 people 35 hours

A 33 year old hiker was reported overdue in Catalina State Park. He had gone for a long hike the previous day, intending to hike up Mt Lemmon and return. He was somewhat equipped for finishing his hike by dark. Horse riders at the north gate reported seeing a subject matching the description, turning off the road/trail on the trail leading to the Romero / Sutherland Trailhead (basecamp). The hiker had a dog with him, so wasn't interested in seeing any official people. So he evaded the red shirts (posse), but ran into the orange shirts (sara), and would have had to deal with a lot of yellow shirts (candidates) a short distance later. But we were all outside of the wilderness area at this point. The dog was sufficiently pooped that we can only guess that he completed his trip as planned.
