ARCH PAGERS: PERSONAL ACCOUNTS

Personal accounts are now available through Arch Paging. Authorization forms are available from Mykle or Bill Kelleman. The forms provide what Arch needs to save you a lot of money, and to include the search and rescue paging groups. Fax the forms to the Arch office to get started.

You can save about \$15 per year in administrative costs by arranging to make quarterly payments rather than monthly. You can save about \$20 per year by making annual payments.

If you want to personalize the greeting for your pager number, then you'll need Voice Mail. That adds \$1 per month. Otherwise, you aren't really sure whose pager you are calling!

Also available is a News Feed, and there is no charge. News updates are periodically sent to your pager, but in a way that you are not bothered by the alert tones. They are stored separately from your pages, and can be reviewed at your leisure.

It takes about a week for your new pager to be prepared. Our account person is Sue, and she will call you to arrange a meeting, either at the Arch office on Oracle north of Prince, or at a mutually agreeable location.

Send an email message to an Arch alpha pager, using the address <u>your-pager-number@epage.arch.com</u>, like mine: <u>5205316438@epage.arch.com</u>.

We will continue to page callouts using the Verizon group numbers for the immediate future. When the number of pagers on that system dwindles, we will decide when to pull the plug and let everyone know.

08 0900, Sunday Pena Blanca Lake

July Training - will be held on Sunday, July 8 at Pena Blanca Lake. Please meet at 9:00 am at the parking lot of the lake. We will need a couple of people to help with gear prior to the meeting at the lake. Please contact Rich or Fran to arrange transportation of the dive gear. We again will test our strength and ability to navigate through the desert kelp forest of Pena Blanca Lake.

Drowning is a silent killer and happens quickly. I remember back awhile of a young girl who was watching her little brother near the swim beach. Her brother stepped off a ledge, slipped underwater and drowned. She tried to rescue him and drowned also. That same scenario almost occurred again at last month's training. Five children - ages ranging from 2-9 years old, were playing at the base of the pedestrian bridge near the Patagonia Lake marina. The two-year-old (later found out to be named Michelle) fell off the shore into the lake just as the Diver's pontoon boat was motoring by. No one older than 9 was in sight. Mike Vohland recognized the emergency, launched off the boat within seconds and swiftly swam the 20 yards from our pontoon craft to the little girl. He carried her up onto the shore looking for her parents or an adult guardian. Not a parent was around! Her sister was 8 and "didn't know how to swim". No one was wearing a life jacket. There was a brother, also around 9 years old. He wanted to keep fishing, but Mike told them they had to leave.

After retrieving Mike, the team motored around the east end of Lake Patagonia. Five "two-man" teams dove on a line search pattern, then performed a free swim search and compass tracking. The team of Mike Vohland and Wren Keller first found a dive mask (glad to report it wasn't one of ours) and later in the muck the same duo found a Honda 30 amp generator. It's in pretty good condition...must have been recently lost...still had gasoline in its tank. Well, it *was* a generator. It's an anchor now.

The challenge is now on to find bigger and better "stuff". Diver's will be holding a "lake sale - fund raiser" at the end of our season to boost our treasury. Hope to see you at Pena Blanca with your large capacity "goody bags".

This course will cover basic aspects of desert survival and SAR operations under desert summer conditions. It will include lectures and practical exercises on the following topics:

Desert Environment	Hot Weather Health, Physiology, and Illnesses;
Water and Field Water Sources	Personal Equipment Requirements;
Desert Shelters	Desert Movement and Navigation
Desert Vehicle Operations	SAR Operations in the Desert Environment

This course is strongly recommended for individuals with limited experience in hot weather operations and camping; it's a great opportunity to learn. Students will be instructed on preparation for a 30 hour field session over a course of approximately 10 miles without re-supply. Loaner equipment is available for those who don't have their own, and students who will be unable to participate in the entire class may still attend select portions of the exercise.

NOTE: Students with medical conditions that might affect their ability to operate safely in hot weather should consult with their physicians before undertaking the field session. Support roles requiring less exertion and exposure to the elements are available. All individuals should verify their individual fitness status with Dr. Ken Iserson or Henry Jacobs (cell phone 275-6486) or e-mail henryjacobs@gwest.net.

TUE 29 MAY CALL 2001.034 2 people

Two hikers were unsure which way to get out before dark. They called 911 by cellphone, reporting the numbers of the trails that joined at their location. Trail numbers have changed, but a call to Stan the Lookout Man at Lemmon Rock sorted that out, and confirmed that they were at the west end of the Wilderness of Rocks Trail. Two members were on top of the mountain on other business, and walked down to meet them. All were out before dark.

6 hours USFS

SAT 02 JUN CALL 2001.035 18 people 112 hours R38 LL407 MLFD A male hiker fell and struck his head. He was bleeding from an ear and disoriented, so his companions called for help by cellphone. The preliminary description was insufficient for Mt Lemmon Fire to find the group. Additional information was fed to Ranger 38, who located the group on trail west of Marshall Saddle. The medic was dropped off about five minutes away, and Ranger returned to base to pick up night vision goggles. A fuel pump warning light grounded the helicopter. Ground teams continued into the field, carrying the patient by litter to the trailhead, then by Mt Lemmon Fire to the Bigelow Junction, then by helicopter to the hospital.

MON 04 JUN CALL 2001.036 20 people 37 hours AirCare RM72

A 49 year old female was wandering north of Redington Road across from Tanque Verde Canyon. She tired of the heat, didn't have any water, and twisted her ankle. Passers-by heard her cries for help. She rode a mule back to the road.

CALL 2001.037 **TUE 05 JUN** 98 hours 15 people

Two 14 year old hikers were overdue on a group hike from the top of Mt Lemmon into the Wilderness of Rocks via Marshall Saddle. Teams started on several trails, and voice contact was quickly made from near the top of the Aspen Trail. Other teams approached from the saddle, and people at Lemmon Rock provided ears on the third side. The moon was bright, so the boys kept trying to move towards the teams shouting from one direction, then another. Finally they just sat and waited for a team to arrive and lead them out.

SAT 09 JUN CALL 2001.038 13 people 43 hours R38

A 41 year old dirt bike rider was missing from the Rosemont Junction area in the north end of the Santa Rita Mountains. Search teams were all mobile, covering the network of 4WD roads from Box Canyon to the north, from the east and west. The subject walked out to a residence on the north and got a ride to Corona de Tucson. He thought he was going over Gunsight Pass, but wound up going over the pass leading into Sycamore Canyon. The bike overheated and wouldn't start after cooling off for awhile, so he had to walk awhile. He and a companion returned to pick up the bike later that evening.

WED 13 JUN CALL 2001.039 10 people 66 hours

Three 21 year old male hikers were overdue in Spencer Canyon. They had intended to climb a ridge next to the campground, then meet a companion and return. They wound up well down canyon, probably at the top of the high falls in Palisades Canyon. They turned around and covered a lot of the distance back to the campground by dark. Teams hollered from the overlooks into Sabino, Sycamore, and Palisades without hearing any responses. The hikers did respond to shouts, but could not see any lights.

THU 14 JUN CALL 2001.040 11 people 68 hours R38

Search continues for three 21 year old male hikers in Spencer Canyon. The daytime coverage repeated much of what had been done overnight, and extended the search area downhill. The team hollering from the Spencer Overlook heard the hikers respond, and spotted their fire near the canyon bottom about a half-mile downstream from the campground. A team headed downstream to meet them as Ranger 38 joined the search. A bare rock provided a suitable pick-up spot, and the group was quickly ferried out of the field.

THU 14 JUN CALL 2001.041 8 people

32 hours R38 A 21 year old male hiker was overdue in Catalina State Park, while the Spencer Canyon search continued. He and a companion hiked up the Sutherland Trail to the end of the 4WD road. His companion decided to turn around while he intended to hike up the trail, then down to Romero Pass, and back to the park, all in three hours. He made it almost all the way up to the high point, then

turned around at dusk, finding his way back down the trail. He missed the turnoff to the park, continuing down the road, then leaving the road to follow the powerline. He climbed up the next ridge and found the 50 Year Trail, and walked down to the Equestrian Center, then along the roads back to the trailhead. That completely avoided the search teams.

SAT 16 JUN CALL 2001.042 6 hours C510 6 people Two hikers were having problems with knees and the heat on the Sabino Canyon Trail above the end of the road. Both were able to continue moving down to the road, leaving nothing for SAR people to do.
