JANUARY TRAINING EVENTS

Saturday, January 05 - Snow Training: Moving on the snow, snow anchors hauls and lowers in the snow environment. Meet 0730, 05 January, Sheriff's Substation 106. Come dressed for the occasion, bring your favorite cold weather lunch, and snow gear. Maybe this time Walt will play picket. The practice should end at 1400 or a callout, which ever comes first. Jim suggests Pizza afterwards; the first pizza is on the Prez.

Sat, Sun, January 19-20: CAMRA High Altitude Mountaineering Training: CAMRA (Central Arizona Mountain Rescue Association) will be having their annual Winter overnight training on Humphrey's Peak (12,633 feet) north of Flagstaff. Their plan is to drive up Friday evening, sleep in the parking lot to acclimatize, get picked up the next morning, and climb to 11,500 feet where they will bivvy. The next morning is planned training on Mountaineering & Rescue skills (ice axe & crampon use, ice axe arrest & ice axe belays, Team roped ascending & crevasse rescue). This does require some advanced skills & equipment. For more information, call Walter Pickett @ 292-9422.

Sunday, January 27 - Field skills recertification, 0800 to 1200, at the SARA HOUSE - Rusty? Need a little refreshing? What is a "Z system"? Give Jeff Merrill a call for a helpful and very informative ATTP Session. Remember just call Jeff at 745-2310

Wednesday, January 30 - Winter Survival Presentation: Henry Jacobs and company will be presenting a class on Winter Survival. We will share thoughts and experiences on Clothing, Equipment, Mental attitude, and other thoughts on how to survive and enjoy camping and operating in the snow. The class will prepare you for the Winter Overnight training that will be held on Feb 2-3 after the Mock MRA recert. The class will start at 7pm at the SARA House. DECEMBER TRAINING REVIEWS

Saturday, 08 December: Approximately 9 SARA members braved the blistery winds on Mt. Lemmon to learn more about anchors & anchor systems, especially when the Trees/Vegetation are not as robust as we would want them to be. Scotty Clemans and Cathy Wasmann presented an excellent presentation on anchors. Thanks guys for your help.

Saturday, 15 December: Nine hardy souls braved the first snow of the year for our first impromptu snow practice. We put on our snowshoes, some for the first time, and slipped down the Butterfly Trail for about a quarter of a mile. Walter Pickett led the way, but soon John, Rian, and Brian each took a turn at trail breaking in the 18 plus inches of snow. Just a reminder to all when moving across snow, snow fields, and glaciers: it is good to keep a good distance (at least 20') between team members. This makes for better hearing of returned shouts, and not everyone will fall into our many crevasses or avalanches. Our progress was slow and steady on the way up, Brian accomplished this without the use of snow claws and poles. Back at the top we set and tested snow anchors, bollards, ice ax T's, and pickets using ice axes. The first 18" inches was powder, great for skiing and not for great anchors, but thanks to the snow plowing we were able to make a bollard; it even passed an 8 people - 15' fall dynamic test. Yes!!!! Heads up we will try more of these impromptu practices as weather permits. Special thanks to all whom joined us especially Walter and Mykle for encouragement and sharing knowledge. Karmin rules after her first time on snowshoes.

MT LEMMON SKI PATROL

The basic mountaineering overnight is scheduled for the weekend of January 26/27 at Sunrise Resort. The class session will either be at Sunrise on the day before the overnight or, preferably, at some convenient time/location in Tucson. Those who only need the overnight to complete basic Mountain Travel and Rescue can join us at Sunrise.

The advanced mountaineering field session is a two-night overnight with daytime travel and skiing mixed in. This is scheduled for March 15, 16, and 17 at Lee Canyon. Two class sessions are required before the overnight and will take place in Tucson, Phoenix and Las Vegas, time to be arranged to fit interested people's schedules. The overnights are intentionally scheduled to allow anyone to take basic and advanced classes in one year.

SAT 08 DEC CALL 1.080 12 people 12 hours

A 55 year old female hiker injured her ankle on Blackett's Ridge in Sabino Canyon. Her companion assisted her slowly down trail, and met rescue people a short distance from the trailhead.

MON 17 DEC CALL 1.081 12 people 13 hours

A 74 year old male hiker was overdue on the Finger Rock Trail. He was returning down trail and it got dark about the time he passed the spring. His small flashlight ran out less than a half-mile from the trailhead. The search team walked him out without problems.

FRI 21 DEC CALL 1.082 14 people 41 hours RMFD

A 62 year old female hiker was exhausted on the Ventana Canyon Trail. Her companions were assisting her, but it was getting late and she was feeling worse, so they called for help. While rescue teams were on the way, they continued slowly down canyon, chasing the remaining sunlight, and were within 10 minutes of the Forest Boundary. Rescue people got lots of clothing on her, and within a half hour she had almost finished off a liter of dilute Gatorade and a little food. As she got moving down trail, she started feeling well enough to continue, and continued out with assistance, with the Stokes following her out.
