Meet at the Circle-K, Tanque Verde and Tanque Verde Loop at 7:30 am, Saturday, March 02.

It's getting warm again and the students will be coming back with their coolers of beer and other “things”. SARA hasn't been there on a mission for a while, so it seems logical that we visit Tanque Verde Falls and familiarize ourselves with the canyon bottom, and the anchors. Mykle Raymond will lead a familiarization hike around Tanque Verde, while Henry Schneiker will coordinate a mock rescue from one of the popular evacuation routes. We may even practice passing a knot too. You'll need your rescue pack and technical gear.

### February Training Review

Situation: A SARA rescue team was “teleported” to the base of Pike's Peak in Colorado Springs in order to support El Paso County SAR who were all involved in a major avalanche recovery higher up on the mountain. The SARA team boarded the Cog railway and got off above timberline to rescue an off route snowboarder who had broken his leg.

So with no trees, we set up two anchors: one was a snow bollard and the other was set up using ice axes. The patient was way down the slope, so we had to tie ropes together in order to reach all the way. We passed knots thru both brake bar racks using a Mariner's hitch. We also discovered that the Mariner's hitch works great on the brake bar racks in the event of a whistle test.

After lowering Steve Archibald down to the victim, we switched one of the lowers to a 3-to-1 “Z-haul”, rather than creating a separate mechanical advantage. That means we would have to pass a knot thru a mechanical advantage system on the way up! By the way, we used the big prusik-minding pulley for the pulley at the anchor.

The first knot pass was easy. On the second pass, we used a Mariner's hitch below the knot as the progress-capture rescuender, as we removed the original progress-capture rescuender. We then extended the prusik-minding pulley using a prusik from the haul bag.

This gave us enough room to get the knot on the other side of the pulley and continue the haul until we had to pass the knot again on the lower prusik. We got Steve and our snowboarder up with no problems.

And as suddenly as we were teleported to Colorado, we were “teleported” back to the road just above the ski lodge on Mt. Lemmon. As we were packing up, Jim Gilbreath and John Perchorowicz got an idea! We used John's winch, a dynamometer, and a pulley around a tree below to test the Snow bollard anchor. A lot of folks were expecting the bollard to fail, but John put over 1000 lbs on the anchor without failure!!!

### MRA News from Saturday, 16 February

Richard Kunz, Rob Offerle, John Carroll, John Perchorowicz, Mike Comeau, Steve Archibald and I were up at the Snow Bowl for a MRA recertification. SARA was to participate in the recert, but with so few people we thought it was best to postpone until we can hold it here in Tucson. CAMRA went ahead with their team while SARA members participated as observers and graders.

The problem was simple, a fall victim in Alpine conditions and a confused reportee. The patient had an avalanche transponder on his person that would make the search a little easier, we hoped. Snow conditions on the mountain were 4 to 6 inches of powder granular snow with greater depth in shade and shelter spots. CAMRA was to simulate travel and searching under avalanche conditions. The first team roped up, providing a harness and crampons for the Reportee. Butterflies for all who were connected to the rope, placing their strongest and most experienced at the rear to catch a fall, watch conditions and monitor his team. Moving up-slope to a point where the lead evaluator had designated an avalanche chute. Here the decision was made that falling was a greater danger than avalanche so the group crossed together with some dispatch to the next safe area, keeping an eye toward the possible slide.

At the other side the Reportee stated that he thought this was the area his friend had fallen from. The team set snow anchors, ice ax deadman with additional ice axes into to the snow for added strength and a person belay as a searcher went over the side with locator in hand. They made rather short work of finding the victim's beacon and then about 20 yards away, the victim. Cool, head, injured. Tim Kovacs provided first care, while a raise was being prepared. A simple three-to-one was enough to raise the victim; he was well packed in. During the raise a knot was passed (ouch). The victim was transported by ground to the parking lot. During this process we listened to Ranger29 and some SAR folks doing a Heli-rappel practice. Ranger wanted to join us but we were able to communicate that this was only a practice and not an operation (rats).

After returning to the parking lot CAMRA demonstrated avalanche probing, both coarse and fine. We did a quick debrief in a near by snowfield and headed down the mountain to Mona Luisa's for pasta and good fellowship. Congratulations to the members of CAMRA, you demonstrated good skills and maybe taught others something along the way. Just think you don't have to do this again for a while good going. Yes!
