We'll meet before the SARA General Meeting

After the SARA Meeting, the program will be about Cave Rescue. We'll show the video from the Cave Rescue Training that Bob Buecher did two years ago, and discuss a couple of topics related to Cave Rescue. The program should not be longer than 1 hour. I hope you will all come early and stay for the program.

May 04 08:00, Saturday Cave Rescue Training

Meet: "108", Irvington and Houghton

Members of the local Grotto, Central Arizona Grotto, Kartchner Caverns Rangers and a couple from CAMRA will be participating. We don't know yet which cave we'll have permission to use. Be prepared for some Single Rope Techniques to be utilized as well as some good "dirty" fun to be had by all.

A woman has reported to the Deputy that her Father & her two children are overdue from a caving trip to Cave of the Bells. The Mother reports that her Father is an experienced Caver & knows Bells very well. She also reports that the two children are in good shape & have been caving elsewhere for several years.

This is the annual SARA Cave Rescue Training. Members of the local Grotto, Kartchner Caverns Ranger & maybe a couple from CAMRA will be participating. You probably do not need your harness & personal ascending/descending devices, but we will probably need to rig a vertical haul & lower in at lest one place in the cave.

June 08 08:00, Saturday Helicopter Training

We will meet at the airport (south Plumer Ave. off Valencia, in the parking lot just south of Ratliff Aviation) and the training will be for hover ingress/egress. This training is NOT for new candidates, as DPS has very limited air time. Participants should be on time or they will be locked out. Airport security is tight.

A male was reported missing, he had said that he was going walking to do some thinking, his vehicle was found at the trailhead at the top of Mt. Lemmon. Teams covered trails through the Wilderness of Rocks, and around the top of the mountain during a windy night.

Mt Lemmon, Catalinas

Continuation of search. Friends from Phoenix wanted to help look, they were asked to look around the top of the mountain. They discovered his body near the top, well off trail, where he hung himself.

9 35 75ym hiker exhausted

Hugh Norris Trail, Tucson Mtns. NPS 234 232

A couple that lives in Ireland most of the time had returned to Tucson. The gentleman wanted to get back in shape and had been doing some walking. He tried a longer hike, and was returning from Wasson Peak when he tired and ran out of water. A park ranger met him at the saddle where the Hugh Norris and SE (Sendero - Esperanza) trails meet. Volunteers joined them, and after resting and rehydrating they strolled down to the trailhead.

2.024 020421 Sun 10 33 57y, 7ym hikers disoriented Marshall Saddle, Catalinas

Two hikers became disoriented at Marshall Saddle while using a simple trail map with numbered trails. They called for help by cellphone. Teams made voice contact from near the saddle and retrieved the pair a short distance down the Wilderness of Rocks Trail.

2.025 020424 Wed 12 27 68ym hiker cardiac problem Romero Canyon Trail, Catalinas R38 LifeNet CatStPk GolderFire

One of a group of hikers from Rancho Vistoso tired while returning from Romero Pools. He had a history of cardiac problems and thought that he recognized the onset of a heart attack, so he popped his medications and was possibly affected by overdoing it. A medic and a couple SAR people were ferried with a litter by Ranger to the scene just past the "slot". He was carried to the landing pad near the Visitors Center and transferred to LifeNet.
