

Bullock Fire: HAM Repeaters

Location: SARA House, 3455 N. Craycroft

All of the repeater equipment in Loma's Ham shack on Mt. Lemmon was removed before the roads up the mountain were closed due to the Bullock Fire. We are now using the RACES 448.550 MHz (tone 110.9) repeater at the top of Mt. Lemmon. This repeater is one of those that we have recommended for many years, but the tone has recently changed. There is a Ham Radio page on the SARCI web site (address above) that lists several repeaters that cover areas of interest to SAR people. All TRA and RACES repeaters are OPEN.

The ownership of several Tucson Repeater Association repeaters have been transferred to the Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. The local RACES ham group works closely with both TRA and OEM, so that's how these repeaters are now listed. The repeaters have been moved from Mt. Bigelow and from Loma's shack to the GATOR site. Their new location looks to the west better than any other site that Tucson hams have had available, so you can reach the repeater by mobile radio from places in Ajo, and by handheld radio on the northwest side of Tucson that is deep in the shadow of the site of our usual repeater.

Bullock Fire: MilePost Zero Checkpoint

TRAINING REVIEW: Cave Rescue Training

We had a small turn out due to an on-going search in the Reddington Pass area. The rescuers immediately found a victim sleeping in the truck and provided valuable information as well as a partially completed map of Cave of The Bells. Three of the rescuers responding to the training were former SARA members, including Larry Brewster, now also a member of The Superstition Wilderness SAR Team in Apache Junction. Two teams went into the cave and immediately found the first victim, who was evacuated by SKED.

This three-man team along with three more SARA members and cavers successfully evacuated the patient without the need of technical rope rescue. The other team got a little misplaced in the cave, but Dave Hamer as well as Dennis and Rebecca O'Sullivan helped get that team straightened out and found the last victim, who just needed to be assisted out.

An interesting innovation to the Cave Rescue training was Bob Buecher's homemade cave radios: A CB radio with a large antenna and 12-volt battery. Though they are rather bulky, they worked amazing well and no telephone wire or cave phones were used.

George is a very informative instructor, has lots of experience in the Sonoran desert and knows the mission of SARA. George has retired from SARA and lans to walk the entire length of the Arizona Trail (north to south) sometime in September.

June 29 09:00, Sat Desert Survival Training: Field Meet: Pima Canyon Trailhead

This is the hands-on training part of the Desert Survival Training. Be ready for a Rescue of an injured climber approximately 6 miles from trailhead. You'll need your full rescue pack and water. Temperatures should be in the 100's.

A female hiker broke her ankle well above "milepost" 0.5, in a fork of Soldier's Canyon. A lengthy carryout use 13 separate belays and lower systems, but went smoothly.

2.027 020429 Mon11 20 22ym hiker exhausted Finger Rock Trail, Catalinas R38 RMFD

A male hiker rode his bicycle to the Finger Rock Trailhead, then hiked about halfway up Mt Kimball. He had eaten little before and during his outing, and had a minimal amount of water. He called for assistance from Finger Rock Spring. Rest, rehydration, and a setting sun got him going again.

2.028 020430 Tue 13 16 Hikers in distress 7 Cataracts, Catalinas R38

Two separate reports were received of people in distress below 7 Cataracts Vista Point. They got to the road as initial teams arrived.

2.029 020503 Fri 4 13 ??ym missing Tanque Verde Canyon, Rincons R38

A male was reported missing, having been last seen a week before, and his vehicle was found at Tanque Verde Falls. An initial evening search did not find anything.

2.030 020504 Sat 24 166 ??ym missing Tanque Verde Canyon, Rincons R38

Continuation of search. Several teams worked in all directions, especially upstream above the Upper Falls.

2.031 020505 Sun 13 70 ??ym missing Tanque Verde Canyon, Rincons

Continuation of search. A few additional areas were covered without results. Suspended search pending additional information.

2.032 020505 Sun 16 44 ??ym hiker stranded on cliff Barnum Rock, Catalinas

A hiker climbed up and behind Barnum Rock, then to the top. He tried to descend down the rock, then became stranded close to the bottom. He was reached from below, anchors were scrounged from the rock, then he was lowered to the ground.

2.033 020507 Tue 4 15 ??ym hiker disoriented Mud Springs, Palisades Trail, Catalinas Customs

A hiker headed down the Palisades Trail, heading for a pickup at the Prison Camp. The trail eluded him below Mud Spring, and his wanderings didn't help, so he requested assistance by cellphone. A customs helicopter tried to spot him without success, but was able to determine roughly where he was. With that guidance he got back to the trail and was met by a SAR team shortly above the spring. He appreciated the extra water, and the assistance staying on trail as the sun set.

A male hiker became exhausted below Lemmon Rock Lookout. We assisted Mt. Lemmon Fire carrying him the rest of the way up.

50 32ym climber fall victim Windy Point, Catalinas Lifeline MLFD RMFD USFS A male climber injured his arm, with possible c-spine involvement. We assisted Mt. Lemmon Fire with a haul system to the road.

2.036 020519 Sun 12 33 6y 10ym stranded on cliff Milton & Gunsight, Tucson R38 Survey1 DHFD

Two boys became stranded on a 150' cliff. One of the boys was on a ledge with a rattlesnake that probably bit him without envenomation. Two rescuers were lowered, one for each of the boys. Everyone reached the bottom in good shape.

2.037 020522 Wed 5 5 ??ym hiker chest pain Rose Canyon Lake, Catalinas **MLFD**

A male was reported to be having chest pain while hiking near Rose Peak. Mt. Lemmon Fire reached the person quickly, and determined that he could walk with assistance. They quickly returned to the parking lot, suggesting that he was just along the shoreline and not up the trail to the peak.

2.038 020522 Wed 8 16 ??ym hiker disoriented Romero Pools, Romero Canyon, Catalinas A male hiker was reported exhausted at Romero Pools. A Catalina State Park ranger made voice contact before getting to the pools, then dropped into the canyon to meet him. He was in good shape, just disoriented after losing the trail. Teams chased him all the way down the trail.

2.039 020523 Thu 20 119 ??yf missing Loma Linda, Catalinas

A female was missing along the Catalina Hwy while trying to find Rose Canyon. After she was reported missing a day later, her vehicle was found at Loma Linda. Mt Lemmon Fire people reported giving her directions early in the morning after she was last seen. Search teams located several items associated with her, leading along a line dropping down the slope below the picnic area. A bag of mediations was included, with recently-filled pill bottles almost empty. One team probably passed within a couple hundred feet of the victim, but she was either sleeping or was not responding due to her medical condition.

2.040 020524 Fri 9 67 ??yf missing Loma Linda, Catalinas R38 MLFD and others Continuation of search. One team was available on a Friday. They dropped down a drainage below the last item found, and located the woman about 1000' vertical below her car. She was bruised, dehydrated, and disoriented after spending a couple of nights in the woods while sleeping off her excess medications. A dozen people wound up at her location, most from fire people that were preparing to fight the Bullock Fire. Ranger 38 delivered tools and supplies, then the large woman was packaged in a diaper seat with additional harnesses, then short-hauled up to the road. The teams dropped down the slope another 400' vertical to the Crystal Springs Trail, then walked out to the Control Road for pickup.
