Actually we GPS'd the water surface altitude at 3625 feet +/- 25 feet. Two inches of silt line the quarry, and three-foot thick patches of fresh water plants grow on the bottom. Minnows are abundant, nothing more than three inches long. The thermocline begins at 27 feet. The maximum water depth was 40 feet but most of the bottom lies at 20 - 25 feet. A fun and interesting time was had by all.

October training will be at Sahuarita Lake. Rendezvous at Rich and Fran's at 0800 to help haul gear.

November's training will be our annual elections and potluck.

It was an interesting month for SRDI. We were called out on a homicide case to search for second body near Ajo & Sandario roads. We had a couple SARA folks joins us. We did a line search with K-9's working in front of us going east to west toward the body found. Next we searched from the body to the South. A third search was done with Quad ATV's to the South. A second body was found to the North of a ranch where they had worked so at this time the case is closed.

We were called again by the Tohono O'Odham Police CID to search for a missing Native American male that had ran off into the desert ten days before in the village of Gunsight near Why, AZ. We used Quads with Patches working off of the back of one. Our assignment was to check out mine shafts for possible cadaver smell. Patches alerted on a ridge across from Vi and Paul went to check it out only to find a human skull. Patches alert was at least 150+ feet away. Police took control of the scene and we continued our search and discovered a stop station of discarded clothing and backpacks. We searched the items only to find a plastic bag filled with sizeable amount of white powder. Police came in and collected it.
