For those who would like to review their basic skills (SARA Orange Card items) Walter Pickett will hold "Augmented /Testing, Training and Proficiencies" (ATTP) sessions every third and fourth Fridays 1800 to 2100 at the SARA House.

<u>April 5</u> <u>08:00, Saturday</u> **Basic Search Training**

Jim Gilbreath will be coordinating an indepth Basic Search Training at the SARA House at 0800. Topics to be covered will be: Hasty (Type I) search techniques; Efficient (Type II) search techniques; Grid line (Type III) search techniques; Man tracking; Search Theory; Clue awareness; Passive search techniques; Attraction Techniques; Confinement techniques; Working with search dogs; Night Search Techniques; Basic understanding in the ICS system. There will be a Sunday Morning training in Mantracking. RV will be the east end of Broadway at 0800. Then, Jim will have a night search exercise for everyone to put the skills they learned to the test. RV will be at the east end of Broadway at 1700 hours. I think the person we'll be looking for is named Mykle???

May 09–11 TBA Arizona Sonoran Desert Seminar

This is a classroom & field presentation on the Arizona Sonoran Desert by George Price. George Price, (an old member of SARA) is a very informative instructor, a trained naturalist, & has a lot of experience in the Sonoran Desert. George wrote the Desert Survival

section for the Army & The U.S. Marine Corps Field manuals (vintage 1970), he has taught Desert Survival at The Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum, 3rd USMC Force Recon, U.S. Navy SEAL Team 6, U.S. CUSTOMS SERVICE, The USGS & the Australian Special Air Service. George has retired from SARA and has plans to walk the Arizona Trail soon. The classroom portion will be in Classroom C at Northwest Medical Center (6200 N. LaCholla Blvd.) at 6pm on Friday the 9th. Subjects to be covered will be: The Makeup of the Sonoran Desert; The Physiology of Man Under Survival Stress; and Survival Equipment.

The Field Trip Rendezvous will be at SARA House at 0700. W'ell be carpooling from the SARA House to the Box Camp trailhead The field trip will start at the Box Camp trailhead. George will presenting information on 4 biomes we'll walk through on our way to Sabino Canyon Vistors Center. The field trip is not mandatory, but highly recommened & will be very informative. The field trip will be 24 hours long & have an overnight bivyy. This is a great opportunity to try out equipment & techniques you would use on a search mission. For those who can't stay out overnight, There's a few places you can meet the tour at: The Box Camp trailhead, the Pine creek crossing junction at top of Sabino Canyon trail, or at Hutch's Pool. These are also good places to leave the tour if you have commitments later. Subjects to be covered on the field trip will be: Survival Methodologies; The Mental Techniques of Survival; An Alert and Inquiring Mind; The Removal of Stress From Decisions; Assessment of Situation; Building a Survival Plan; Managing and Reassessing the Plan; Making it Work; Thorn & Scrub Biome; and Coniferous Biome.

Plan on being out of the field Sunday the 12th before dinner. You can bring anything you want to carry for the Field trip, you just have to carry it yourself. If anyone would like to help George out, please contact Walter Pickett at 440-4059.

A couple of donkeys were reported to be wandering around. Deputies requested assistance from the Posse. The animals were easily rounded up. (no response roster received)(what did Dan do with the donkeys?)

3.009 030309 0 0 ??yf hiker seizures

A hiker was reported to be having seizures. The patient was a short distance up trail, and was escorted out as rescue people were meeting at the gate.

3.010 030315 12 101 2 hikers overdue Romero Pass Trail, Catalinas Survey1, R38 Two hikers were reported overdue. One had been dropped off in Summerhaven, intending to hike to Catalina State Park. His wife hiked up to the pools to meet him, but was not able to make contact with their FRS radios. She ran into a disoriented hiker, and the two returned to the trailhead, so one of the missing hikers was out. A team hiked up the trail without making contact by the time they reached the base of the switchbacks above the pools. Survey1 (Sheriff's fixed-wing STOL surveillance aircraft) was unable to find anything of interest from their orbit at 10,000'. Ranger38 responded with their FRS radios, and the helicopter noise woke the hiker and got him to turn his radio back on to make contact with the crew. He had not been able to follow the Wilderness of Rocks Trail with the snow and numerous trails of use, so he started downhill in very rough country, coming down Lemmon Creek. The coordinates were a half-mile up Lemmon Creek above the confluence with Sabino, a mile above Hutchs' Pool. There weren't any suitable LZ's visible in the moonlight, so Ranger dropped a Blanket Bag with warmies and nourishment. A couple of teams arrived soon after dawn, and Ranger found an LZ that had been set up for firefighting. Everyone was ferried out just as the storm moved in.

The SARA Code of Conduct

SARA members are professionals and volunteers and must at all times put SARA's best interests first. The following is our Code of Conduct:

- 1. A SARA member treats fellow members, members of other agencies, and the public with respect at all times. Our existence as an organization depends on it.
- 2. A SARA member does not argue on an operation. After appropriate (and discrete) discussion, if a member still disagrees with what is happening, there are two options: remain silent, continue to participate, or remain silent, sign out, and leave the operation. Further discussion should take place at a Board meeting.
- A SARA member never asks why another member wasn't on an operation. We are volunteers, and we participate 3. when able.
- 4. A SARA member does not criticize an operation or part of an operation for which they were not personally present.
- When wearing a SARA shirt or driving with a SARA emblem displayed, you are representing our group. 5.

The SARA Board is responsible for discipline, conflict resolution, and for making sure that all members understand and follow this Code of Conduct. On an operation, SARA members are responsible and accountable to the Board for any actions taken.


