May Monthly Training

Required equipment: Helmet, wetsuit, personal flotation device (PFD), and canvas shoes or wetsuit booties.

May monthly training is Swiftwater Rescue Training. In order to participate in the training, you must have successfully passed the swim test. The swim test will consist of 5 laps with PFD, 5 laps without PFD and five minutes of treading water.

The swim test will be conducted at Richard Giachetti's pool on May 2 at 2:00 p.m. and May 5 at 6:30 p.m. Giachetti's pool is not heated. You can wear wetsuits for the test if you wish. Directions to Giachetti's house are:

Swan past Sunrise to Skyline, Left on Skyline to Columbus, right on Columbus to Cocopas, Left on Cocopas to first right which is Placita Sierra, first house on left. 6821 N. Placita Sierra.

-or-

Campbell to Skyline, turn right and stay in the left lane, which turns into Sunrise just east of Campbell. Left back on to Skyline a quarter mile east of Campbell, left on Columbus, then same as above.

Car pooling is recommended. If you have successfully completed the swim test within the last three (3) years, you will not have to retest.


Building Fund Raising

-.--- 040325 1 1 ??yf hiker knee injury Agua Caliente Canyon A group of 5 backpackers had camped about a mile up Agua Caliente Canvon from the confluence with Milagrosa Canvon. Late afternoon of the following day they were hiking back down to camp after a short hike upstream with 2 companions that had joined them for the day. One of the group injured her left knee while negotiating the slippery stream. A SARA member and friend just happened to run into them while on a day hike, within 10 minutes of the injury occurrence. The SARA member was able to talk to Deputy Doug via cell phone and Ranger was requested. The patient was assisted by the group of 8 back to the campsite that was large enough to use as an LZ. Ranger arrived as the group arrived at the camp and the patient was airlifted to Deputy Doug's truck without incident.

4.014 040328 14 27 ??ym climber fall victim **Ridgeline**, Catalinas A climber was injured on a climb at Ridgeline, above the turnoff to Sollers Point. Mt.Lemmon Fire treated and packaged the patient, and with the help of a fire crew carried him to the road. The last 50 yards is steep and rocky, so SAR people managed a belay down the slope.

4.015 040329 8 16 74ym missing Valencia & Casino del Sol A subject had been missing for several days. A ground search of open areas was requested. Soon after teams were in the field, he was found at a motel in Tucson.

4.016 040330 11 37 ??ym hiker ankle injury Kent Springs Trail, Santa Ritas A hiker injured his ankle partway down the Kent Springs Trail. The incident was reported to be on the Bog Springs Trail. Canoa Fire would normally cover Madera Canyon, but they were busy on a fire, so Green Valley Fire responded and hiked to the scene. The patient was packaged and the party carried him down the trail as SAR people arrived and started up trail. A road was found (normally closed) that intersected the trail, so the patient was transferred to vehicle for a ride to the road.

4.017 040330 9 27 Cadaver search Los Reales & Santa Clara TPD No report -.--- 040403 0 0 Overdue Hiker Samaniego Trail, Catalinas Deputy Jess requested help looking for an overdue hiker on the Samaniego Trail. While waiting for us, he drove down the Mt. Lemmon Trail, and made voice contact with the hiker. Soon after, he met the hiker and we were cancelled. It was snowing on top.

4.018 040406 31 99 4 Fall victims Tanque Verde Falls, Rincons R38 RMFD A male from Kansas was hiking with his nephew in Tanque Verde Canyon. He fell into the second Turkey Pool and rode over the third falls, sustaining a gash on one knee and an ankle injury. He was unable to hike out of the canyon, so assistance was requested. While we were responding, an unrelated group of three was at the first pool. A woman slipped into the pool, rode over the second falls, and was having problems getting out of the turbulence under the falls. Her two companions jumped in and helped her to the side where bystanders pulled her out. The two then washed over the third falls. One of them sustained back and internal injuries, and was pulled onto a ramp just downstream. The other companion sustained a head injury and was unable to get out from beneath the falls (the Washing Machine). Victim #3 was packaged on a backboard, then short-hauled by Ranger 38 to the road and transferred to a second helicopter. Victim #1 was bandaged, then short-hauled in a triangular sling. Victim #2 walked out, thanks to boots

contributed by a member with feet of a similar size. Victim #4 remained overnight in the Washing Machine. 4.019 040407 21 164 ??ym body recovery Tanque Verde Falls, Rincons

Victim #4 was removed with some effort from the Washing Machine, and hauled up the Turkey Chute.
