

September's training will be at Parker Canyon Lake and rumor is that the lake is full. We will practice setting and executing various search patterns. On August 3, 2004, divers were called to assist Tucson Fire and Police at 2230 hours with a drowning recovery at Lakeside Lake. A big thank you to Deputy Rick Sturgeon and Tucson Fire personnel for their assistance. Our condolences go out to the family of Jeremy Butler.

Thanks to Cathy Wasmann, Doug Myrvold, Richard Kunz and Fran Kunz, who recently attended a technician course offered by OTS and are now certified technicians for repair and maintenance on the Mark II dive mask.

#### **Diver's Callout Information**

The Pima County Search & Recovery Divers were paged August 3, 2004 at 2240 hours to recover a 16-yo male missing in the Lakeside Park Lake on the east side of Tucson. Tucson Fire Department personnel waded into the water and used a Zodiac but were unable to locate the missing teenager. Divers arrived at Lakeside Park between 2300 and 2330 interviewed witnesses and set up their equipment and search patterns. Witnesses provided two points-last-seen which lay 30 feet apart. Divers rigged a search line along the bottom encompassing both points. Dive Team One swum to the search buoys. Team Two stood suited-up in shallow water. Team One made contact with body half way through the first sweep. Tucson Fire assisted divers in bringing the body to shore. All divers departed Lakeside Park at 0045 Wednesday morning.

SARA helicopter training with DPS - hover ingress/egress - will be scheduled as time allows in September. This training is the highest level of helicopter training available to every SARA member, and very useful on operations involving insertions by air. Personal safety is, of course, paramount. Therefore, anyone wishing to take part in this training must have static helicopter training beforehand. Required clothing is long pants and long sleeves, preferably cotton (more fire resistant), with goggles and helmet. The new helicopter puts out a lot of wind, and blows more (and larger) stuff around, so more protection is necessary. Bring your pack so we can get used to handing packs in and out of the aircraft. There will be a page before the training to alert everyone to the event. This training will most likely be done at the airport in the morning when it is cooler. 15:15 – 16:30 A female hiker with a knee problem was reported on the Butterfly Trail near Novio Spring. Mt. Lemmon Fire found the patient close to the Soldier's Camp trailhead and evacuated her without problems.

4.042 040731 Sat 11 37 37ym leg injury

Tanque Verde Falls

11:50 - 15:20 A male jumped into a pool in Tanque Verde Creek (upstream from the Turkey Falls). The water was not as deep as he expected. He was evacuated by stokes up the Main Trail.

4.043 040801 Sun 11 37 Vehicle rollover

Chivo Falls, Chute route

19:20 – 22:40 A 4WD vehicle rolled in the Chute on the first route into Chivo Falls. A female passenger was reported to be injured. Rural Metro got Brush 72 down to the top of the Chute. They walked down, located and packaged the patient, carrying her by stokes back to the truck. The driver was also evaluated, and he appeared to have more serious injuries, so he also was packaged. Ranger landed by the main road due to darkness. Both patients were transported 3/4 mile up to the main road in Rescue-3, with assistance from rescue people scouting the best route along the rocky road.

22:40 – 01:00 A 16y male was fishing with friends and family in Lakeside Park, on Stella east of Pantano. He entered the water to free a stuck fishing line, and was last seen while returning to shore. TFD searched with firemen wading and from a boat, then requested divers. Several points-last-seen were evaluated, resulting in a relatively small search area. The first team located the body as they turned for their second sweep.

4.045 040808 Sun 13 26 Body recovery

Empirita Ranch, Empire Mtns.

12:10 – 14:50 People from BLM located human remains near Bootlegger Well in Cienega Creek. They reported their find to the Empirita Ranch, who called the Sheriff. GPS coordinates guided a deputy to the scene, and determined that the old road up the wash was not passable. SAR was requested to assist with recovering the remains.

4.046 040808 Sun 9 19 Injured quad rider

R52 RMFD

While the previous call was being organized, a quad rider was reported injured in Redington Pass near Piety Hill about 15 miles from the end of the pavement. RMFD and Ranger 52 responded, and requested SAR assistance. The patient was evacuated by helicopter with minimal help.

Pontatoc Ridge Trail

14:50 – 16:10 A 45ym hiker on the Pontatoc Ridge Trail called by cellphone to report that he was out of water, lightheaded, and unsure of the trail back to the parking lot. A deputy reached him about 1/2 mile from the road, and was shortly joined by SAR volunteers. He was rehydrated and escorted out of the wilderness.

Bear Canyon Trail

18:30 – 18:50 13 & 14 y male hikers were reported missing on the 7-Falls Trail. Another report suggested that one might be ill and sitting along trail. A deputy found them along the road. Another two from the same group were then reported to be overdue. They were found further along the road. All were returned to the parking lot.

19:35 – 02:30 Two hikers were ill equipped, and ran out of water when their trip took longer than expected, and it was getting dark. They had gone down the Lemmon Rock and Wilderness of Rocks trails. They reached the Mt. Lemmon Trail after being delayed for several hours while losing the trail due to the Aspen Fire. Teams met them above the junction and walked them out without problem.


08:25 – 12:40 A 11yf autistic was reported missing on Tuesday evening. Wednesday morning SAR resources were requested. She was reported to have left with a dog and a "fluffy" chicken. Ranger 52 covered the area from the air, SAV volunteers combed the neighborhood, and SAR teams worked the desert areas. She had walked about ten miles uphill to the west, over the tailings, and into a rural neighborhood. An unoccupied residence had a phone, but she didn't know where she was. 911 operators provided that information and she was shortly picked up, with dog and chicken.
