Experienced SARA members will bring their training and experience to the SARA House for a day long seminar on backcountry travel and winter skills. Topics to be discussed will include what to wear and carry when its cold, expedient shelters, food and water, and much more. Participants are asked to bring the gear they would need if called out for a search in the snow. Here's a list of the gear you'll need:

Pack (big enough to hold all gear)

1 Days worth of food

Sleeping bag (20 degree minimum) Full length sleeping pad (inflatable or closed cell foam)

Bivouac sack (optional) Tarp or poncho, or 3 ml plastic sheeting (at least 5x7 used for shelter material)

Synthetic or wool long underwear Insulating layers (wool, fleeces, pile)
Wind protection garments (top and bottom)

Down or synthetic jacket (optional)

Insulated boots Gaiters

Sunglasses or goggles.Personal Hygiene itemsMap of areaSnow shovel (optional)CompassSnowshoes (optional)

Ski poles Headlamp and 2 other sources of light.

Water bottles Trail food
Whistle Matches
1 or 2 long burning candles 30-50 of cord
Pocket knife First Aid kit
Space Blanket Two trash bags
Sunscreen 4-8 Heat packs

Stove gear (stove, windscreen, fuel container, matches or butane lighter)

Cook gear (pot big enough to melt snow for water)

Insulating layers for extremities (glove liners, insulating gloves, mittens)

Insulating layers for feet (extra pairs of sock liners, socks

Insulating layers for head (balaclavas, bomber hats, neck gaiters)

This is the hands-on portion of the Winter Orientation seminar. Rendezvous at 106 at 09:00. After a pack check, we'll go up the mountain to the Butterfly Trail and begin the exercise. The training will focus on skills the rescuer needs to function effectively in the cold. Anyone who would like to experience the backcountry in winter is invited. We'll overnight off the trail, so bring your sleeping bag, sleeping pad, and a tarp for shelter material. We should be off the mountain by noon on Sunday.


5.003 050109 Sun 5 5 21yf hiker ankle injury Finger Rock Trail, Catalinas




5.004 050116 Sun 13 13 ??ym hiker ankle injury 7 Falls Tr, Bear Canyon, Catalinas
