

SARA BUILDING FUND UPDATE

Dear SARA members:

We'd like to update SARA members on where we currently stand with progress towards building a new SARA training and headquarters. Much has happened over the past six months. In the spring, we entered into negotiations with Pima County for a lease that would be acceptable to the SARA Board for the new property at Alvernon south of the Rillito River. Those negotiations have been very productive, and have resulted in a lease that we are confident would protect SARA's interests should we decide to build on the property. At the same time, however, several things have occurred that we would like the membership to know about and consider as we decide how to proceed in the near future.

First, the August flooding along the Rillito River raised a major concern with the proposed new property, as it was 80% under water during the height of the flood. The Building Committee was aware that the property would need fill to bring the ground level above the flood plain, and this event helped to clarify just how large a project (and how important) raising the ground level would be.

Second, in the course of the lease negotiations with the County, we have learned that the County's plans have changed. They are no longer planning to demolish the current SARA house at Craycroft to make way for an expansion of the Rillito Park. In fact, it now appears that they are willing to negotiate a new lease for SARA at our current property that would extend beyond 2008. The County has indicated that they would be willing to consider providing the current property to us on a long-term lease (something we did not have before), and allowing us to make major renovations to the existing building, as long as the current footprint of the building does not change.

Before any further negotiations with the County, however, it is very important that we get input from our membership on what they would like to see happen in the future, given that we now have several options. The County has assured us that they will leave both options open (leasing the new property at Alvernon, and continuing at our current location) until we have had time to talk to our members and have a full discussion of how we want to proceed.

We will be discussing this matter at the next SARA monthly meeting on December 1. The first half of that meeting will be open to all members and visitors. After the break, we will be closing the meeting to members only, in order to have a full and frank discussion of our options. This is a very important discussion, and we hope that everyone will attend.

Prison Camp to Marshall Gulch

20:01 – 20:24 A hiker was overdue on a day hike from the Prison Camp via Romero Pass to Marshall Gulch. Tom Kittle, a former SARA Member and Vertical Mile Champion (yes, it's THIS month!) was training for a Grand Canyon hike and was slowed while keeping track of the grassy trails. He arrived soon after the call.

6.078 060925 Mon 13 33 Backpackers overdue Mar.

Marshall Gulch to Prison Camp TucsonRanger

09:16 – 13:21 Two backpackers were overdue on a trip from Marshall Gulch via Romero Pass to the Prison Camp. Tom Kittle had heard some shouting as he was close to the top of the climb out of Romero Pass the previous afternoon. The two had lost the trail below Romero Pass on Saturday, spent most of Sunday waiting for someone to pass by, but never saw Tom. Sunday evening they headed down the bottom of West Fork, and were near Hutchs' Pool on Monday morning. They had plenty of food and water, and good maps. Tucson Ranger spotted them and dropped two rescuers a short distance away. The backpackers were retrieved in good condition and all were flown out to Sabino.

6.079 060930 Sat 9 16 62ym hiker exhausted Blackett's Ridge, Catalinas

14:58 – 16:14 A hiker was exhausted, out of water, and unable to continue on Blackett's Ridge. Hikers passing by provided some water, and he was able to continue down, meeting rescue teams along the Phoneline Trail.

6.080 061001 Sun 0 0 Two hikers out of water Esperero Trail, Catalinas

14:04 – 14:22 Two female hikers were reported to be out of water, one hour up Esperero Canyon Trail. They made it out shortly after we were called.

6.081 061011 Wed 11 81 Two hikers overdue Palisades and Bear Canyon

19:57 - 04:00 16y and 54y hikers were overdue on a hike down Palisades and Bear Canyon. They were last heard from about 15:00, reporting a short distance above the bottom of East Fork, and sounding tired. Teams headed in from Bear, Prison Camp, and Sabino. As all teams converged on both ends of East Fork Trail, the Sabino team found the pair at Pine Creek Crossing. They didn't know that water was available along their route in Sycamore, so headed down East Fork until they found water near Sabino.

6.082 061013 Fri 0 0 ??y? Fall victim

Lower Sabino Canyon

10:56-10:59 A person was reported to have fallen several minutes from Tram Stop 2. It sounded like we would be needed, but the Tram Stop is in Lower Sabino with most of the access to the scene by road, so the patient was easily retrieved and she refused treatment.

6.083 061014 Sat 9 18 19ym hiker off trail Ventana Canyon, Catalinas

15:52 – 18:00 A 19ym intended to hike up Ventana and down Esperero. He called his father, reporting not being able to find the trail and getting low on supplies, and being on the east side of Ventana Canyon. As teams started up Ventana, he and his father managed to get him back on trail. He met the teams on the switchbacks below Maiden Pools.

6.084 061021 Sat 10 25 82ym hiker fall victim

Green Mountain Trail, Catalinas

MLFD RMFD

10:04-12:05 A Southern Arizona Hiking Club group started down the Green Mtn Trail. One of the hikers was slow and unsteady, and he slipped, struck his head, and was even more unsteady so help was requested. MLFD medics checked his condition, didn't find any problems. The patient didn't want a stokes ride, and was able to walk slowly with help back to the road.

6.085 061022 Sun 9 23 UDA recovery

West of I-19, South of Canoa exit

USBP

13:55 - 16:32 A male border crosser became ill and unable to continue. His cousin attracted the attention of a USBP helicopter, who alerted ground personnel. The subject had passed away by the time people arrived. We provided the stokes and people to carry the remains about a half-mile back to the rough road, about six miles from I-19 by road, but not that far directly.
