UPDATED: SARA HOUSE ENTRANCES DURING CONSTRUCTION

Craycroft and River are now only two lanes, and no turn lane. We strongly recommend NO LEFT TURNS either into or out of the River Road or Craycroft entrances, due to limited visibility, congestion at the traffic light, and the usual traffic. If traffic is light, fine, but more caution than usual will be needed.

Plan your route so that you approach the entrance from EASTBOUND River Road (Swan Rd). There are no safe places to stop on westbound River while waiting for a break in traffic. Traffic behind you could be blocked back into the intersection. Continue to the top of the hill where you can turn around safely going eastbound. When leaving, you can easily turn east on River, then north or south on Craycroft. Again, turning west on River is not recommended unless traffic is light.

We recommend NO LEFT TURNS either into or out of the Craycroft entrance unless traffic permits you to turn without stopping. So you need to be traveling SOUTH on Craycroft. When exiting, it is a sharp right turn onto SOUTHBOUND Craycroft, otherwise you will wind up in the opposing traffic.



Target Audience: All members and candidates who think they might go out in the desert this summer!



7.033 Sat, 14 Apr 4 12 2f hikers off trail 15:41 - 17:25

Oracle Ridge, Catalinas Two females hiked down Red Ridge and up Oracle Ridge when they lost the trail and called for help. Tucson

Alvernon & Benson Hwy, Tucson

Ranger spotted them in the canyon between the two ridges and near the trailhead. Teams quickly located them, guided them back to the trail, and all hiked out.

7.034 Sat, 21 Apr 8 16 Cadaver search

18:11 - 20:55Cadaver search. Nothing found.

7.035 Sat, 28 Apr 12 15 76ym hiker exhausted Esperero Trail, Catalinas 09:18 - 10:48A hiker with a group from Canyon Ranch was not prepared for one of the first hot days of the year. He collapsed on the Esperero Trail about a mile from the road and was not responsive for a short while. Rescue teams found him responding appropriately and let him rest some more while drinking and eating a bit. The litter chased him down the trail.

7.036 Sat, 28 Apr 13 50 ??ym fall victim Tanque Verde Falls, Rincons TucsonRanger, NPS, USFS Three people hiked down the SARA Trail and up Tanque Verde Canyon, then headed up the slope near the Main 14:20 - 18:00Falls. They were working their way through the short cliff bands when one slipped and injured his ankle. They called for help, also thinking that they were stranded. They were just below the Rescue Route from the Main Falls Anchor, so ropes were rigged on the loose slopes while Tucson Ranger configured for a short-haul. The patient was lifted down canyon to a sand bar, transferred into the helicopter, then flew to the SARA Trail Parking Lot for transfer to an ambulance. Everyone else walked out without problems.

7.037 Sun, 29 Apr 13 52 ??ym hiker stranded on cliff Molino Basin, Catalinas

11:06 - 11:18 - 14:59 Three hikers were scrambling towards the top of a rocky knob north of Molino Trailhead. They called for help when one was unable to continue up or to return to the ground. Several teams worked their way to both below and above the stranded hiker. One person rappelled to the patient, got him into a harness, then belayed him up the short distance to the top of the rock. Everyone hiked out without problems.

7.038 Sat, 12 May 13 90 18yf hiker ankle injury 7 Falls, Bear Canyon, Catalinas

10:02 - 16:16 Two females were scrambling at the base of Seven Falls when one twisted her ankle and called for help. She was carried and assisted up the large rock steps to the pool at the base of the trail, carried by litter to the last crossing, then by horse to the trailhead. It was a very hot day that exhausted everyone.

7.039 Sat, 12 May 7 31 6 hikers exhausted

Six hikers were heading up Pima Canyon. Two of the more experienced hikers continued ahead of the group to 19:02 - 00:10Kimball, then down Finger Rock Trail. Both groups called for help after running low on water. One of the hikers in the second group had a knee injury (turned out to be chronic). The first pair was met a short distance from the trailhead, and teams continued up trail. Tucson Ranger spotted the second group below Linda Vista Saddle, and landed on the flat spot on the trail at the "corner", flying the knee problem off the mountain. It was then too dark for them to return. Teams continued up with more lights and water, and everyone hiked out without problems in the less-hot evening.

7.040 Sat, 19 May 8 65 4 hikers off trail

Two adult males and two children were hiking from Palisades on the Butterfly Trail. They lost the trail near the 22:03 - 06:15Crystal Springs Trail junction and headed uphill until steep terrain and sunset stopped them. They requested help, Tucson Ranger spotted them four hundred feet below Soldier's Camp and six hundred feet above Butterfly Trail. One team headed down the steep and rocky slope while another went down trail, then up a ridge. One of the adults was moving slowly. Everyone went down to the trail and started towards Soldier's Camp, arriving just after dawn.
