UPDATED: CRAYCROFT CONSTRUCTION

Craycroft construction is almost complete. The speed limit is 35mph, except where work is being done. The final (second) layer of pavement has been laid over the north half, but will not be extended south until warmer weather, so there is a bump at the transition. WATCH OUT! There is no longer an entrance off of River Road. The Cravcroft entrance is wide and level, but not lighted and minimally marked. Lanes are marked with a turn lane, so the entrance is as good as it's going to get. This will be the last update on this project!

Small and short-haired dogs should wear sweaters when taken for walks during cold winter weather. 

8.001 Sun, 06 Jan 14 74	Stranded hikers	Sabino and Bear Canyons,	Catalinas TucsonRanger, USFS

15:10-23:15 An initial report from four people stranded by floodwaters at Stop 4 in Sabino turned into 61 people ferried by TucsonRanger to the helispot. Many were at Stop 4, many were at the old Group Picnic area in Lower Sabino, others were scattered in Sabino and Bear Canyons. None were injured, just stuck. We need to find a high water vehicle (that will fit over the bridges).

8.002 Sun, 06 Jan9 33 Missing trail runnerSabino Canyon, CatalinasTucson, Phoenix Ranger(22:17) - (07:33) - 10:43 While we were dealing with the stranded hikers, a trail runner was reported missing. He was not one of the
masses retrieved by helicopter, and none of them had seen the runner. Ranger had covered most of the trails in the area, with detailed
coverage in areas that were more suspect. Two teams were dropped off on Blackett's Ridge (and by the time they got down to the
trailhead, the water level was low enough to retrieve them by vehicle). In the morning teams started up Sabino and in from Gordon's
Place (Prison Camp), and Ranger spend another hour looking in the daylight. They found a tent in Sycamore Basin, but nobody
around. Posse arrived an hour later. The runner had found the tent, supplied with clothing and sleeping bags (but no Room Service),
so he was doing just fine. But he had covered his white T-shirt with a brown coat when Ranger flew over. Phoenix Ranger was
inbound to help the search, and deposited the runner at the helispot.

8.003 Wed, 09 Jan9 44 Hikers stranded by darkRomero Spring, CatalinasTucsonRanger21:16 - 03:00An adult and two boys hiked down from the top of the mountain, choosing to come out Romero rather than Sabinoas they got more behind schedule. Ranger spotted them at Romero Spring and dropped a team nearby. The hikers were pretty tired,especially after cooling off for several hours after dark. All were ferried to the trailhead. Ground teams got to the second crossing,and worked on the Romero Pools helispot in case it would be needed.
