#### SABINO HOUSE PARKING

SARA has been issued a Special Use Permit for the Sabino House (formerly known as the Rod and Gun Club). The road to the area is posted "805", so we may refer to it by that name as well.

The Assistant District Ranger has requested that, whenever possible, we park our vehicles on the 805 road instead of outside the Administrative Gate. And during construction, we will need to use extra care when parking outside of the gate. The vegetation is making the 805 road narrower, so we will need to be more careful to park so room is available for passing (large) vehicles, and this means parking on the right side as you drive in.

Later, our parking will move into the Sabino House area and leave the 805 road clear. If you are going to drive into the canyon, please be sensitive to people who may need rides from the parking area.

We will take time at the January regular meeting to discuss these changes. The proposed changes to the Membership Policy are being published in this issue of SARNEWS, per the existing amendment policy.

A private aircraft was flying low over the area, and spotted the missing subject in a wash about 0.5miles from the residence. Our teams provided initial meds and helicopter support.



The SARA Board of Directors is proposing to amend the SARA Membership Policies. In compliance with the existing amendment policy for the Membership policy (section VI.C), the proposed changes to the Membership Policy were presented to the Board at the December 2008 Board meeting, the proposed changes are being published in the SARCI newsletter and the proposed changes are scheduled to be discussed at the January 2009 general membership meeting. The changes clarify certain issues, rolls all of the membership related items into a single policy and merges the membership policy into a single Policies document as is required by Bylaws Article II (Members) Section 10 (Policies and Procedures). The complete proposed Policies document is available on the SARAdocs web site and is listed as the Draft SARA Policies dated December 20, 2008.

#### It is proposed to delete the existing membership policy:

#### MEMBERSHIP POLICY OF THE SOUTHERN ARIZONA RESCUE ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED

- I. Qualifications for Classes of Membership.
  - A. Members of any class or category must be at least 16 years of age, and minors must submit the approval of parents or guardians. Candidates, with the approval of the Board of Directors, may participate in training programs conducted in accordance with Article of Incorporation IV, paragraph 2.
  - B. Requirements for skill, activity, and certification may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors. Participation on an operation of this organization shall be limited to those members who possess current medical and operational certification(s) as established by the Board of Directors. Requirements may be different for each operational certification.
- II. Voting Members. Members in the following categories must remain Field Qualified [see Section IV below], or they will lose their right to vote [SARA By-Laws (Article II, Section 4)].
  - A. <u>Full Members</u> are individuals (1) who have completed Candidate training, as prescribed in the Candidate Policy, or who have completed some earlier equivalent training; and (2) who have received the vote of the Board of Directors for promotion to Full Member. Full Members pay annual dues and are entitled to wear orange shirts.
  - B. <u>Life Members</u> are Full Members who purchased a Life Membership at some time in the past to enable SARA to buy its first set of radios. Dues for Life Members shall be considered paid. [Note: Life Memberships in SARA are no longer available for purchase.]
  - C. <u>Sustaining Members</u> are Full Members who have made such valuable contributions to safety education or to search and rescue work as to merit some special form of recognition conferred by a vote of the Board of Directors. Dues for Sustaining Members shall be considered paid.
  - D. The status of Life Members and Sustaining Members shall be reviewed by the Board of Directors every five (5) years, beginning in July of 2007. If no contact has been made with a member of either of these categories during the previous five (5) years, the member shall be placed in an inactive status.
- III. Non-Voting Members.
  - A. Field category.
    - <u>Candidates</u> are individuals who have applied to the Board of Directors and have been accepted into the Candidate program. Once Candidates become Field Qualified, they are entitled to wear yellow T-shirts having the SARA logo with the word "Candidate" below it. Candidates pay annual dues.
    - B. Non-field categories.
      - Support Members are individuals who have applied to the Board of Directors and have been accepted for Support training. In order to participate in any operation after completion of training, they must wear green T-shirts with the word "Support" below the SARA logo. They will not go into the field beyond base camp at any time for any reason. Support Members pay annual dues.
      - (a) Full Members, Life Members, or Sustaining Members who are not Field Qualified will become Non-Voting Members. They may retain the category titles which they have attained, although they can no longer vote. The right to vote may be regained only by becoming Field Qualified once again. (b) Such members may not attend rendezvous or base camp unless they wish to act as Support Members [see the preceding paragraph]. When working in this capacity, they must wear the appropriate green T-shirts. (c) Full Members continue to pay annual dues even though they are non-Field Qualified.
- IV. Field Qualification. In order to go into the field beyond base camp for any search, rescue, recovery, or other non-training operation, the following requirements must be met by Voting Members and Candidates:
  - A. Individuals must possess a current medical certification that is at least equivalent to the more stringent of: (1) the National Ski Patrol *Outdoor Emergency Care* certification, and CPR certification at least equivalent to the American Red Cross *CPR for the Professional Rescuer*, or (2) such medical certification as may be required for field operations by the Search and Rescue Council, Incorporated (SARCI).
  - B. Individuals must possess a current SARA Field Skills certification.
- V. Membership Dues.
  - A. Annual dues for all members are payable in advance on the first day of May in each fiscal year [SARA By-Laws (Article XI, Section 2)].
  - B. Membership dues for new members shall be prorated on a quarterly basis for the remainder of the fiscal year, according to the following schedule:

April – June
July – September
October – December
January – March

Full annual dues
3/4 of annual dues
1/2 of annual dues
1/4 of annual dues

C. If a member's dues have not been paid by the first day of July in each fiscal year, the member will be dropped from membership in the corporation for non-payment [SARA By-Laws (Article XI, Section 3)]. In such case, the member must make written application to the Board if he or she wishes to be considered for re-instatement.

- VI. Amendments to Membership Policy. Amendments to this policy shall be made in the following manner:
  - A. An amendment shall be proposed to the Board of Directors at least two months prior to being voted on for approval.
  - B. Before a vote by the Board, the text of the amendment shall be published to the membership in the monthly SARCI Newsletter.
  - C. The amendment shall be placed on the agenda for discussion at a monthly general meeting, subsequent to its appearance in the SARCI Newsletter. A quorum of Board members must be present at this meeting to explain and/or to justify the amendment.
  - D. After discussion at a monthly general meeting, the amendment may be voted on by the Board of Directors. If the wording of the amendment has been changed materially as a result of this discussion, the above process shall be repeated.

#### And to replace it with the following text as Section 3 of the new policies:

#### Membership

- a. Reference Bylaws Article II (Members), Article IV (Board of Directors) and Article XI (Dues).
- b. Membership Qualification
  - Members of any classification must be at least 16 years of age. Minors must submit written approval from a parent or legal guardian.
- c. Member Participation
  - The Board of Directors shall establish requirements for skill, activity, and certification for each classification of membership.
  - ii. Members shall participate on call-outs only to the extent allowed by their current membership classification, medical certification(s) and operational certification(s).
- d. Voting Member Classifications
  - i. Full Members are individuals who: 1) have completed Full Member Candidate Basic Training or prior equivalent SARA training and 2) have received the vote of the Board of Directors for promotion to Full Member. Full Members pay annual dues and are entitled to wear orange shirts.
  - ii. Life Members are Full Members who purchased a Life Membership at some time in the past to enable SARA to buy its first set of radios. Dues for Life Members shall be considered paid. Life Memberships in SARA are no longer available for purchase.
  - iii. Sustaining Members are Full Members who have made such valuable contributions to safety education or to search and rescue work as to merit some special form of recognition conferred by a vote of the Board of Directors. Dues for Sustaining Members shall be considered paid.
  - iv. The status of Life Members and Sustaining Members shall be reviewed by the Board of Directors every three (3) years, beginning in July of 2007. If no contact has been made with a Member in either of these categories during the previous three (3) years, the Member shall be classified as inactive and the Secretary shall attempt to contact the Member. If an inactive Member cannot be contacted in the following three (3) years, the Board of Directors may vote to drop the Member
- e. Non-voting Member Classifications
  - i. Full Member Candidates are Members who have applied for and have been accepted into the Full Member Candidate Basic Training program. Once Full Member Candidates become Field Qualified, they are entitled to wear a yellow shirt having the SARA logo with the word "Candidate" below it. Full Member Candidates pay annual dues.
  - ii. Base Camp Support Member Candidates are Members who have applied for and have been accepted into the Base Camp Support Basic training program. Base Camp Support Member Candidates pay annual dues.
  - iii. Base Camp Support Members are Members who have become Base Camp Support Qualified and are entitled to wear a green shirt having the SARA logo with the words "Base Camp Support" below it. Base Camp Support Members pay annual dues.
  - iv. Support Member Candidates are Members who have applied for and have been accepted into the Support Basic training program. Support Member Candidates pay annual dues.
  - v. Support Members are Members who have completed the Support Basic training and are entitled to wear a green shirt having the SARA logo with the word "Support" below it. Support Members pay annual dues.
- f. Voting Rights

Per Bylaws Article 2 (Members), Section 4 (Voting Rights): only Field Qualified Voting Members shall be entitled to vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the membership.

g. Field Qualification

To be Field Qualified, a Member must:

- i. Be either a Full Member or a Full Member Candidate who has completed Full Member Candidate Basic Training or prior equivalent SARA training.
- ii. Have a current medical certification that is at least equivalent to:
  - 1. National Ski Patrol Outdoor Emergency Care (OEC) certification with supplemental medical training covering items on the Supplemental Medical Training Certificate (Blue Card).
  - 2. Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and a Supplemental Medical Training Certificate (Blue Card).
  - 3. A written authorization from the Medical Director and a Supplemental Medical Training Certificate (Blue Card). To qualify for written authorization, the Member must be an Arizona licensed doctor or nurse and be actively practicing emergency medicine. The written authorization expires after 1 year.
- iii. Have a current CPR certification at least equivalent to the American Red Cross CPR for the Professional Rescuer.
- iv. Have a current Field Skills certification.
- v. Meet all Search and Rescue Council, Incorporated (SARCI) minimum field requirements.
- vi. Be current on dues.
- h. Base Camp Support Qualification

- i. To be Base Camp Support Qualified, a Member must:
  - 1. Be either a Base Camp Support Member or a Full Member.
  - 2. Have a current Base Camp Certification or be a Full Member who has been Field Qualified within the last 3 years.
  - 3. Have a current medical certification that is at least equivalent to such medical certification as may be required for field operations by the Search and Rescue Council, Incorporated (SARCI).
  - 4. Meet all SARCI minimum field requirements.
  - Be current on dues.
- ii. A Base Camp Support Member who is participating at Base Camp shall wear his or her green shirt having the SARA logo with the words "Base Camp Support" below it.
- iii. A Member participating under the Base Camp Support Qualification shall not go into the field beyond Base Camp at any time for any reason. The field begins and thus Base Camp ends at any trailhead, demarcation restricting access or upon leaving the roadway or parking area immediately around the vehicles.
- iv. A Member participating under the Base Camp Support Qualification shall not remain at Base Camp unless they have been given a specific job assignment.
- v. Base Camp Support duties include, but are not be limited to: maintenance of sign-in sheets and associated records, equipment issuance and retrieval, re-packing the rescue truck(s), monitoring radios, transporting SAR personnel to and from assignments by road, obtaining food and drink for personnel coming out of the field.

## i. Membership Dues

- i. Membership dues shall be set by the Board of Directors for the following fiscal year no later than the March Board meeting. Dues for the following fiscal year may be accepted after the dues have been set.
- ii. Per Bylaws Article 11 (Dues), Section 2 (Payment of Dues): dues shall be payable in advance on the first day of May in each fiscal year. Dues of a new member shall be prorated for the remainder of the fiscal year of the corporation, as determined by the Board of Directors.
- iii. Membership dues for new members shall be prorated on a quarterly basis for the remainder of the fiscal year, according to the following schedule:

April – June Full annual dues
July – September 3/4 of annual dues
October – December 1/2 of annual dues
January – March 1/4 of annual dues

#### j. Reinstatement

- i. Per Bylaws Article 2 (Members), Section 7 (Reinstatement): upon written request signed by a former member and filed with the Secretary, the Board of Directors, by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the Board, may reinstate such former member to membership upon such terms as the Board of Directors may deem appropriate.
- ii. A former Member shall be reinstated to his or her former membership classification without restrictions unless unusual circumstances require otherwise.
- k. Membership Policy Amendments

Any amendment to the Membership section of these policies shall be made in the following manner:

- i. The amendment shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for consideration at a regular Board meeting.
- ii. The Board of Directors shall publish the text of the amendment in a standard edition of the monthly SARČI Newsletter or by mailing the amendment to each Member.
- iii. The amendment shall be placed on the agenda for discussion at the next general meeting following publication.
- iv. At least a quorum of the Board of Directors must be present at the general meeting to explain and/or justify the amendment.
- v. If there are any material changes to the amendment as a result of the discussion at the general meeting, the current amendment shall be discarded and a revised amendment shall be submitted to the Board of Directors, starting the process from the beginning.
- vi. The Board of Directors may vote on the amendment at a regular Board meeting at least two (2) months following the submission of the most recent amendment.
