SARCI FIELD QUALIFICATIONS STANDARD

On 1/21/2009 Search And Rescue Council Inc (SARCI) adopted the following minimum Field Qualification standard:

Effective July 01, 2009, the SARCI Field Qualification minimum shall include:

- 1) SARCI Orientation and
- 2) Wilderness First Aid as certified by ASHI, or equivalent and
- 3) CPR for the Professional Rescuer as certified by ARC or AHA, or equivalent and
- 4) National Incident Management System (NIMS) IS-100 and IS-700, or equivalent.

This will replace older policies that cited courses which have not been available for many, many years.

Bring your rescue pack and enjoy a cool morning at the higher elevations. This training involves breaking into teams and practicing accessing a patient quickly and safely. Expected ending time is 1300.

ORAL REHYDRATION

To combat infant and child deaths from dehydration due to diarrhea (worldwide, one of the leading causes of death for children), the World Health Organization (WHO) has long recommended a rehydration solution that can be made in most places. It's very simple:

8 teaspoons of sugar

1 teaspoon of salt

1 liter of boiled water

This was updated in 2006 to include other required minerals, such as potassium and zinc, and WHO now recommends the use of Oral Rehydration Salts, which are available in packets. Various brands of these may be found in outdoor stores and on the Internet. (The homemade version of the new mixture adds one-half cup of orange juice to the above ingredients.)

If you want to use the basic mix, I suggest the following:

Get a small pill bottle with a child-proof cap. Use a measuring spoon—not an ordinary teaspoon. Nine teaspoonsful will just fit in the bottle. Put a double layer of plastic wrap over the top of the bottle before you screw on the lid. Throw two or three of these in your pack.

You'll need a one-liter bottle to measure the water. Then just mix and give it to your responsive (i.e., conscious) patient while you're providing shade and cooling as usual.

Interesting stuff I found while doing research:

- (1) WHO recommends that the drink be "no more salty than your tears."
- (2) GatoradeTM contains 62 grams of sugar per liter, or 15.5 teaspoons. Remember that we recommend cutting GatoradeTM 50-50 with water.
- (3) One liter of Coca-ColaTM Classic contains 216 grams of sugar, or slightly more than 54 teaspoons. That's almost half a pound of sugar in a liter of CokeTM.
- (4) From personal experience, I can testify that some of the commercial rehydration mixtures taste like reconstituted dehydrated sweat. [Yes, I mean that stuff you gave me, Jane.]


