SARCI FIELD QUALIFICATIONS STANDARD

On 1/21/2009 Search And Rescue Council Inc (SARCI) adopted the following minimum Field Qualification standard:

Effective July 01, 2009, the SARCI Field Qualification minimum shall include:

- 1) SARCI Orientation and
- 2) Wilderness First Aid as certified by ASHI, or equivalent and
- 3) CPR for the Professional Rescuer as certified by ARC or AHA, or equivalent and
- 4) National Incident Management System (NIMS) IS-100 and IS-700, or equivalent.

This will replace older policies that cited courses which have not been available for many, many years.

15:00 – 15:07 A hiker reported an injured ankle, but was able to reach the powerline road and picked up by a deputy.

9.094 Sat 22 Aug 11/ 40/ 22,26ym Hikers without lights Green Mtn and Link Trail jct, Catalinas

19:56 - 23:50 Two hikers became disoriented while hiking the Green Mtn and Brush Corrals Trails, and were not able to figure out how to return to the trailhead as the sun set. Teams located them at a trail junction, and all walked out without problems.

9.095 Sun 23 Aug 17/104/ Hikers exhausted Mt.Lemmon Trail, Catalinas

14:58 – 23:00 Two hikers reported themselves exhausted on the Mt.Lemmon Trail above Romero Pass. They were asked to remain at their location, but continued moving and were not answering their phone. Not being sure of which way they were going, teams covered all of the trails leading to the west side of the Wilderness of Rocks. They were located just above the junction at the west end of the Wilderness, and continued up after refreshments were provided. Meanwhile, the team in the Wilderness had met a hiker moving slowly, and met him again after they weren't needed with the original hikers, and accompanied him to Marshall Gulch.

9.096 Wed 26 Aug 15/ 16/ 59ym hiker exhausted 7 Falls Trail, Catalinas

15:54 – 17:17 A hiker was reported feeling ill a short distance up trail. After refreshments, all walked to the trailhead..

09:26 – 20:54 Cadaver Dogs requested to assist PCSO

9.098 Sun 06 Sep16/29/38ym hiker shoulder injury7 Falls Trail, CatalinasRMFD18:12 - 19:37A hiker fell from a standing position and injured his shoulder. He walked out with a bandaged shoulder.

9.099 Mon 07 Sep 13/ 41/24yf exhausted, 13ym foot lacRomero Trail, CatalinasTucsonRanger12:45 - 15:54A hiker was reported exhausted on Romero Trail. Hasty team found her at "The Slot" (saddle#2). She was assistedto the LZ at Saddle#3 and flown out by TucsonRanger. Other hikers reported a 13ym with a foot laceration at the pools. The hastyteam met the party in the broad saddle and carried the patient up to the LZ and was flown out.TucsonRanger

9.100 Thu 10 Sep 9/42/??yf hiker disoriented Aspen Loop, Catalinas

17:15 – 21:16 A hiker reported getting off trail and requested help. She had hiked up the Aspen Trail to Marshall Saddle. She started down into the Wilderness of Rocks before returning to the saddle, then turned up the Aspen Trail while intending to return to Marshall Gulch. She lost the trail and followed a drainage before calling for help. The initial team started from Radio Ridge, making distant contact from high on the Aspen Trail. The team continued to Marshall Saddle, then turned down the Wilderness of Rocks, and found the hiker not far from the trail about a mile from the saddle. After her birthday was celebrated, they headed up to the trail with help from additional teams and all walked out without problems.

12:03 - 15:00 A hiker was having problems with the heat near Romero Pools. While the hasty team was enroute, Ranger hovered nearby and flew the patient to the helipad. The hasty team returned with the patient's wife, who was also feeling the heat.

9.102 Fri 11 Sep 5/93/53ym hiker missing Lost Dutchman St.Pk, Superstitions Multi-county


