A big 'Thank You' to all volunteers who provided medical or communication support to the "24 Hours of the Old Pueblo" mountain bike event of February 12-14, 2010.

Beautiful weather, a fast course and over 1200 riders led to our providing medical assistance to over 100 subjects during the 48 hours we were on duty.

Injuries ranged from minor cuts and scrapes to more serious cuts, avulsions and probable fractured bones. Two subjects involved in high speed mishaps suffered LOC and were evacuated due to MOI and significant other injuries.

The next scheduled opportunity to hone your medical skills will be at the Whiskey Off Road mountain bike event in Prescott, Arizona on April 24, 2010.
