10.095 Sun 29 Aug 14/ 42/ 19ym fall injury

Main Tanque Verde Falls, Rincons **RMFD**

11:35 - 14:20A male was climbing above the pool, then fell onto rocks and into the pool. TucsonRanger was training nearby, and ferried a couple of people and gear to the pool, then left for fuel while additional people and gear hiked down. The patient was packaged and carried to Ranger, then flown to the road and transferred to a medical helicopter.

10.096 Sun 29 Aug <u>10/</u> <u>28/</u> Mtn Bikers dehydrated Tanque Verde Canyon, Rincons

A group of mountain bikers became dehydrated when their trip took longer than anticipated. One of the group hiked uphill to the road, following gunshots from the shooting area, and surprising people as he came over the hill into the line of fire. People provided food and water, and he hiked back to his companions. Rescue teams were uncertain of their location, so were looking for multiple access routes. A team headed in from near the Main Trail on the Blue Line Trail, reaching the canyon bottom where the road climbs out to the south. The group was a short distance upstream, and they were able to hike out with the team, leaving their bikes for later retrieval.

10.097 Fri 03 Sep <u>17/</u> 48/ 62ym fall injury

Upper Tanque Verde Falls, Rincons

A male fell onto rocks in Tanque Verde Canyon, and was unable to walk out due to pain, so he stood in one place for several hours. He had no idea how to describe his location. He didn't know any names of roads or places. His vehicle was located at the Upper Tanque Verde Falls trailhead. Teams headed in from several directions, finding him on the beach at the upper falls. He was backboarded in a standing position, then carried out (horizontally) by litter.

10.098 Mon 06 Sep 13/ 28/ 74ym fall injury

Romero Canyon Trail, Catalinas

A hiker became tired a short distance above the old trailhead, then fainted and tumbled off trail. Rescue teams found him sitting on trail, and he was quickly bandaged, treated and loaded for a carry to the road.

10.099 Tue 07 Sep 8/ 15/ Overdue hikers

Mt Lemmon to Sabino, Catalinas **TucsonRanger**

09:57 - 12:08Four hikers got a late start to hike down a canyon from Marshall Gulch to Sabino Visitors Center. Family members reported them overdue the next morning. The family referred to a hike described in the Arizona Canyoneering book, indicating they intended to come down Lemmon Creek. They had lost their map and directions soon after starting down canyon, and were not well oriented when located a short distance above Hutchs' Pool by TucsonRanger. They were quickly retrieved to the SARA House.

Elephant Head Rd & I-19

A group of undocumented people were apprehended by Border Patrol. Four of the group escaped the way they had 17:50 - 20:57come. One of those captured described leaving (?) her 2yf under a tree on the other side of the freeway. Border Patrol searched the west side while we were covering areas on the east side. BP concluded that those that escaped had picked up the child, and had been moved out of the area. Our search was quickly concluded.

Mt Lemmon to Sabino, Catalinas

Several hikers coming down Lemmon Creek were overdue the next morning. As a hasty team started on trail, the 10:56 - 12:15group called to report they were almost out.

10.102 Mon 13 Sep <u>10/</u> <u>51/</u> Hiker tired

Palisades Trail, Catalinas

17:26 - 23:55A hiker reported being out of supplies and tiredl. Teams met him well below the top, and all hiked out the bottom.

10.103 Thu 16 Sep <u>0/</u> <u>0/</u> Hiker exhausted

Bear Canyon Trail, Catalinas

RMFD

A hiker was reported exhausted. We were canceled after patient made it out.

10.104 Sat 18 Sep <u>21/111/</u> 43ym hiker knee injury

A hiker reported stumbling on trail, injuring his knee on a sharp rock. Teams and equipment made it to the 08:36 - 11:15 - 14:36patient, and requested a helo for team safety due to heat. Customs transported to the road, and teams hiked out.

Palisades Trail, Catalinas

A group reported being low on supplies and requested support. Posse went to Sycamore Saddle, thinking they were 14:54 - 18:12low. Teams met them a short distance below the top, and all hiked out without problems.

10.106 Sun 19 Sep 8/34/Hikers requesting assistance Mt Lemmon to Cat St Pk, Catalinas

A father and daughter were on an overnight hike, and reported problems with finding and following the trail, and 14:29 - 18:48were low on supplies on a hot day. They met the hasty team at Romero Pools, and all hiked out without problems.

10.107 Sat 25 Sep 11/ 17/ 24yf hiker exhausted

Phoneline Trail, Catalinas

12:28 - 14:03Three women hiked to the top of Blackett's Ridge. They were down on the Phoneline Trail when one became unresponsive. She was treated and carried to the road.


