SARA MONTHLY TRAINING

The March monthly training is the Tanque Verde Falls Orientation. Rendezvous is 08:00 at the Circle K, Tanque Verde/Tanque Verde Loop. The training consists of a familiarization hike of the TV Falls area, highlighting many of the prominent features and trails in the area. The area provides us with numerous calls each year, and knowing the area well (including the various names for certain features) can greatly enhance your ability to be effective on a mission. For our new candidates, did you know SARA has several permanently installed artificial anchors in the area? Come find out where they are, and get an orange card training checked off. For all our other members, can you find all of the anchors and the route from the LZ down to the main falls in the dark without a GPS? If not you should come out for a good morning hike as well. Finally, if time and resources allow we will set up a technical system off one of the anchors after the hike.

Mon 30 Jan <u>10</u>/ <u>33</u>/ 57ym hiker stranded by dark Mint Spring Trail, Catalinas MLFD

20:10 – 23:55 A hiker started at Prison Camp, intending to go via Romero Pass and across Wilderness of Rocks to Marshall Gulch. At dark he wound up on Mint Spring Trail and called for help (or his wife did) after he could no longer continue. He was met at the spring and walked out without problems.

Green Valley

Thu 09 Feb 16/16/52ym hiker cardiac arrest Bluff Trail, Sabino Canyon, Catalinas RMFD

18:00 – 18:26 A hiker was found face down, a couple hundred yards down trail from the road in upper Sabino. CPR was started, immediately and he was worked all the way to TMC before being pronounced deceased.

Fri 10 Feb 11/ 13/ 53yf rider thrown

Sutherland Wash, Catalina State Park GRFD

14:40 – 16:28 A rider was thrown and complained of back pain. She was carried to the north boundary gate and transported.

Sat 11 Feb 9/23/ Two female hikers lost

Linda Vista Saddle, Catalinas

15:58 – 19:15 Two hikers on the Finger Rock Trail arrived at Linda Vista Saddle and could not find the trail. They didn't realize that they were at the end of the spur trail to the saddle. They were visible in binoculars from the trailhead, so once we verified that we were seeing the correct people, they were directed back to the trail. Hasty teams met them above the overlook, and all walked out without problems.

Tue 14 Feb $\underline{0}$ / ??ym hiker overdue

Rincon Peak, Rincons

18:10 – 18:15 A hiker headed up from Happy Valley, intending to go to Rincon Peak on a day when inclement weather was expected. His father reported his concern, and SAR officers responded. The hiker had not returned by the time they arrived and investigated, so they were ready to start up trail and requested volunteer support. As they started the hiker returned, having reached the peak as the storm arrived.

14:00 – 15:10 **NO ROSTER RECEIVED**

Sat 18 Feb <u>13/</u> <u>68/</u> 41yf hiker ill

Sycamore Basin, Catalinas

12:05 – 16:55 Three female hikers went up Bear Canyon, and intended to come down Sabino. When they reached Sycamore Basin, one became ill and could not continue. Teams started in from Prison Camp. Their cellphones were not working well, so we could not verify their location. Using binoculars from Thimble Peak Vista Point, the command team could see hikers at the top of the old trail that drops from Bear Canyon Trail into the basin, so the hasty team was going to go up the cutoff trail. We observed the hikers then continue towards Sycamore Saddle, and redirected the hasty team. They met the hikers a short distance from the saddle and tended to them for a while before starting to move. The hiker was feeling much better with all of the attention (and after eating and drinking), and hiked to Sycamore Reservoir before accepting a horse ride up the hill.

Wed 22 Feb 13/ 16/ 75ym hiker exhausted

Phoneline Link Trail, Sabino Canyon, Catalinas RM

17:00-18:15 Two hikers rode the tram and hiked down the Phoneline Trail. One became exhausted, and was unable to continue. The hasty team followed the companion up the Link Trail and met the hiker a short distance up trail. He had rested, and enjoyed the refreshments from the team, and was able to walk down to the stream crossing. He accepted a stokes ride across the rocky stream.
