09:15 – 09:30 Doggies were requested to assist with an urban search that was quickly cancelled.

Fri 23 Mar 0/ 0/ ??ym injured Stop 8, Sabino Canyon, Catalinas

12:11 – 12:35 A male was reported injured, off the roadway. No assistance was required.

Wed 28 Mar 6/ 6/ 66ym hiker exhausted Starr Pass, Tucson Mtns DHFD

15:50 – 16:20 Hikers from Starr Pass Hotel became disoriented and requested help after they had been out much longer than intended and one was exhausted. They were met in Starr Pass, walked to the trailhead, and returned to the hotel.

Wed 28 Mar 8/31/2 hikers lost Montrose Canyon, Catalinas Survey

21:40 – 01:20 18ym and 22ym hiked up Montrose Canyon looking for Romero Pools, and called for help after dark. Survey2 spotted their fire, verifying the location. Teams dropped into Montrose from the Romero Trail at the broad saddle before the pools, and all hiked out without problems.

Thu 29 Mar 11/ 25/ 70ym fall injury Bear Canyon Trail, Catalinas RMFD

13:50 – 16:20 A hiker tripped and injured his face on the switchbacks. The group got almost to crossing 6 before asking for help. He was treated and rode a horse to the trailhead.

Fri 30 Mar 12/ 37/ 45yf fall injury 7 Falls, Catalinas Tucson Ranger, RMFD, USFS

12:50 – 16:05 A hiker slipped off trail at 7 Falls, falling to the rocks below. Tucson Ranger landed at the base of the falls, treated and carried her to the helicopter. Foot teams and equipment were enroute.

Sun 01 Apr 15/50/61yf hamstring injury Romero Pools, Romero Can., Catalinas GRFD

10:20 – 14:00 A hiker slipped while climbing out of Romero Pools and injured a hamstring. She got a stokes ride out.

Thu 05 Apr 8/ 12/ 2 hikers overdue Lemmon Rock Trail, Catalinas

20:20 – 22:00 Two males hiking up Mt.Lemmon from Catalina State Park were reported overdue. As initial personnel arrived at the family waiting on top, one hiker appeared. His companion was moving more slowly up the Lemmon Rock Trail, and was picked up on the road to the lookout.

Sun 08 Apr 10/ 23/ 51vf hiker exhausted knee Finger Rock Trail. Catalinas

16:40 – 19:20 Several hikers were returning from Mt.Kimball. One was having knee problems and moving very slowly. Teams started in, meeting one of the group that had hiked ahead to retrieve supplies, then met another who had continued after the third could not continue. Tucson Ranger landed at the corner where the injured hiker was waiting, and flew him to the trailhead.

Mon 09 Apr 17/ 48/ 18ym hiker stuck on waterfall Main Falls, Tanque Verde Canyon, Rincons

18:20-21:40 A group of people were moving up Tanque Verde Canyon when they found the Main Falls. While climbing to ledges from which to jump into the water, one became stuck. Rope systems were rigged at the top, and a rescuer rappelled to the patient and picked him off.

Mon 16 Apr 5/30/ Cadaver Search I-10 & Toltec Rd

10:30 – 16:30 A report of a buried body was checked by dogs. Nothing found.

Mon 16 Apr 3/ 14/ 63ym fall injury Arivaca Lake, Tumacacoris AVFD GVFD RMFD C&BP LL3

13:10 – 17:45 Several people were scrambling near Arivaca Lake when one fell and was reported to have injured his arm. He injured his shoulder, and was unable to walk given the rough terrain. He was carried to LifeLine3 waiting on the dry lakebed.

Wed 18 Apr 17/109/ 21yf hiker exhausted knee Romero Canyon, Catalinas

18:30 – 01:40 A pair were hiking up Romero Canyon, looking for the pools. They climbed out of the bottom, expecting to find the trail, but were going away from the trail. They called for help when one could not continue with her painful knees. Teams went up the bottom of the canyon, then climbed a steep slope to the pair, while another team found a route from the trail. A C&BP A-Star was able to pick her up, and everyone else returned via the route to the trail.

Sat 21 Apr 30/147/ 6yf missing Broadway & Craycroft, Tucson TPD

18:40-01:45 A girl was last seen Friday evening after being put to bed, and was missing in the morning. We were asked to assist covering alleys and dumpsters during the evening, and several teams searched two neighborhood areas.
