SARCI MINIMUM FIELD QUALIFICATION

SARCI has expanded the minimum field qualification requirements for all groups to include PCSD-NIMS (formerly known as õNIMS-138ö) and Arizona Basic Search and Rescue training. These requirements will become effective at the end of 2014, so there is time to get anyone missing one or both up to speed. Please refer to the SARCI Field Qual Report (available on line or from Records) to see who needs to complete these classes.

The SARCI Field Qualification minimum requirements shall include all of the following:

- **SARCI** Orientation
- Wilderness First Aid as certified by ASHI, or equivalent
- CPR for the Professional Rescuer as certified by ARC or AHA, or equivalent
- National Incident Management System (NIMS) IS-100 and IS-700, or equivalent

MRA Reaccreditation

The Technical Rescue Group will be having its second rehearsal for the upcoming MRA reaccreditation in technical rope rescue. This will be on Sunday, October 19, with rendezvous at 106 at 0800. All Members are invited to come and observe the training and to participate in some parts of it. This is an opportunity to see how our MPD systems are used for lowering and raising in a vertical environment. It's also a chance to see what kind of skills are needed for these operations. Future regular trainings will be designed to help you develop these skills.

The actual reaccreditation is scheduled for Saturday, November 1. This is required every five years to maintain our standing in the Mountain Rescue Association.

Technical Skills

The next Technical Skills Training will be in October. If you have not attended a classroom session previously, that will be held on Wednesday, October 22, at 18:30, at the SARA House. The field exercise will be on Saturday, October 25: meet at 106 at 08:00; the exercise will be held at the Prison Camp. Pre-registration is required due to limits on class size.

As of August 22, 24 people have never taken the class, and their old field skills certification will expire on January 1, 2015.

Sixteen other people took the class in November or December of 2013, and they need to renew their technical skills certification by December 31, 2014.

Also, 37 Members qualified in January 2014, and they will have to re-qualify by the end of January 2015.
