The SARCI activity database has been expanded to include all types of activities. All groups are encouraged to complete a Roster for all activities, including Missions, Training, Public Relations, Meetings, Special Events and other Activities. The Rosters can be scanned and sent to Records, or sent to the SARCI mailbox, or placed on the Records desk at the SARA House. Remember that times are important, but can be approximate. Access to the database is available to an authorized representative from each group.

SARCI MINIMUM FIELD QUALIFICATION

SARCI has expanded the minimum field qualification requirements for all groups to include PCSD-NIMS (formerly known as "NIMS-138") and Arizona Basic Search and Rescue training. These requirements will become effective at the end of 2014, so there is time to get anyone missing one or both up to speed. Please refer to the SARCI Field Qual Report (available on line or from Records) to see who needs to complete these classes.

The SARCI Field Qualification minimum requirements shall include all of the following:

- SARCI Orientation
- Wilderness First Aid as certified by ASHI, or equivalent
- CPR for the Professional Rescuer as certified by ARC or AHA, or equivalent
- National Incident Management System (NIMS) IS-100 and IS-700, or equivalent
- Effective 12/31/2014: Pima County Sheriff's Department local protocols, commonly referred to as "PCSD-NIMS" (aka NIMS-138)
- Effective 12/31/2014: Arizona Basic Search and Rescue as defined by the Arizona Search and Rescue Coordinators Association, or equivalent, commonly referred to as "AZ-Basic"

The monthly training for December will be Land Navigation. This is a sign-off on the old Orange Card, and is one of the ways (also the most relevant way) to get the Land Navigation sign-off on the training records issued to our most recent candidate class.

A classroom session will be on Wed. 03 December, at 19:00 at the SARA House. Material to be covered includes topographic map reading, using a map with a compass, and the basics of GPS usage. At the end of the classroom session there will be a couple of short field exercises so please come prepared with appropriate footwear/clothing and your rescue pack. The classroom session is not mandatory, but will be beneficial particularly to newer people as the field session will not have much instruction.

The field session will be on Sat. 06 December, at 09:00 at the SARA House. The training will consist of a land navigation course around the Sabino Canyon area, with each leg of the course designed to test a specific skill. Candidates and members alike are encouraged to attend; experienced rescuers will be very helpful assisting teams. Those who attended previous years are also encouraged to participate and can help guide the newer candidates. The course is designed to utilize various navigation skills, including using various functions of your GPS unit that could be helpful on a SAR mission.

Those of you who own a GPS should bring it, and make sure you have read (or at least skimmed) the owners manual.

An RSVP for the field session is requested no later than the night of the classroom so that we can pre-plan teams. If you have a GPS unit that you can bring, please indicate such in your RSVP.

SHERIFF-1 HELICOPTER AWARENESS LEVEL TRAINING

FIELD QUALIFICATION TRAINING

In order to remain field-qualified, you must keep up-to-date on your medical, CPR, and technical skills qualifications. It is your responsibility to make sure that SARCI Records has your latest information.

The SARCI Field Qualification Report is found on the website at http://www.sarci2.org/data/SARCI%20NIMS%20FQ%20Rpt.pdf. The expiration dates for the medical and CPR qualifications are given in normal notation, e.g., 6/7/2015 is June 7, 2015. Dates in red have expired; dates in yellow are getting close to expiration.

There are three entries under SARA Rope Systems: **Aware**, **Oper**, and **Tech**. A check mark in the **Aware** box indicates that you have seen the Awareness Level PowerPoint presentation, which must be viewed only once. The date under **Oper**[ator] is the year and month that your annual technical skills qualification will expire, e.g., 1412 is December 2014 and 1507 is July 2015. The same is true for the **Tech**[nician] column.

This report is updated frequently, so please keep track of these important dates. You will not be notified individually when these qualifications must be renewed. It's up to you.

18:40-01:20 Two hikers started on Mt.Lemmon. One was experienced and fit, the other wasn't and pooped out just below Romero Spring. They continued down trail in the dark, stopping and making a fire at the 3rd crossing. The hasty team found them, fed and watered the hiker, ankles taped for support, and hiking poles provided. He had lots of company for the slow hike down.

Sun Oct 19 <u>0</u>/ <u>0</u>/ 34ym missing

Campground, Catalina St.Pk, Catalinas

02:40-03:10 A male was missing from a family group. He was located by family before volunteers arrived. A second call was brewing in Molino Canyon, but the missing subject appeared while the investigation was in progress. Go back to bed.

Sun Oct 19 11/ 34/ 47ym depressed

Linda Vista, Catalinas

Survey1

23:00-03:15 Oro Valley PD found the vehicle of a male reported missing. Survey 1 found the subject about a mile up the Pusch Peak Trail. As the lights of officers approached, a gunshot was heard. A team of SAR volunteers was requested to help recover him.

Mon Oct 20 11/22/58yf hiker ankle injury

7 Falls Trail, Catalinas

11:55 – 14:15 A female hiker injured her ankle at crossing 5 on the 7 Falls Trail. She was carried out by horse.

Fri Oct 24 8/ 43/ Hunters lost

Turkey Creek, Rincons

15:10-21:00 Two hunters were lost in the Turkey Creek, Happy Valley area. They had been without food and water. The hasty team found them at their cellphone coordinates. A daughter had been heard hollering in the area, but uncertain whether she was also lost. The second team ran into her on the trail a short distance from the trailhead. After rehab, they were able to hike to the trail to join other teams and hike out.

Sat Oct 25 8/41/ Hikers without water

Gibbon Mtn, Catalinas

Survey1

20:45-02:00 Three hikers climbed the canyon above milepost 0.5. Two called for help when the third returned to their start without telling the others, and we met him at their vehicles. Teams hiked from the Prison Camp to the two near Gibbon Mtn. They appreciated the warmies and refreshments and walked out without problems.

Wed Oct 29 1/ 15/ 68yf hiker missing

White Tanks Mtns, Maricopa Co.

04:05-19:15 A hiker did not return from a hike on the east side of the mountains and resources from other counties were requested as the search continued. On Wednesday a team from several agencies was flown to the area where track had been lost, and followed them onto a ridge overlooking the western slopes before losing them. The following day, a Dept of Corrections team picked up the track and followed them to the remains of the hiker.

Sat Nov 15 5/ 10/ 16ym dirt bike crash

Empire Ranch, Sonoita

13:20 – 15:00 A bike rider crashed. Customs & Border Patrol and Sonoita Fire located and treated the patient. A route was found for an ambulance to reach the scene, so additional resources were not required. His condition deteriorated, so he was transferred to a medical helicopter at the Border Patrol check station.

15:30 17:55 A hiker rolled her ankle a short distance from Romero Pools and a stokes ride was planned. Due to sunset getting close and in consideration of patient comfort, Sheriff 1 was requested and landed at the LZ next to the trail at the pools. As teams returned to the original scene, the next call was received.

Sun Nov 16 19/ 46/ Hikers lost

Montrose Canyon, Catalinas

17:55 – 20:50 Two hikers dropped a vehicle at Catalina State Park, then drove to Pima Canyon. They intended to hike up Pima and down Alamo, but were unable to find that canyon (it's not easy) and continued down Montrose. After dark they were not close to being out, and weren't sure of their location and called for help (a helicopter flying by may have had an effect). SAR teams were just returning to the previous scene, and lights were visible up Montrose Canyon. A team dropped into the canyon bottom and met the pair a short distance upstream. All walked back to the trail and down to the trailhead without problems. Our new yellow shirts got to play!

Mon Nov 17 11/ 25/ 63ym hiker lost

Pima Canyon, Catalinas

15:50 – 18:15 A hiker was unable to follow the trail (probably at the exposed rock at the first dam) and called for help. Other hikers passing by pointed out the trail and accompanied him down to meet the hasty team. All walked out without problems.
