The SARCI activity database has been expanded to include all types of activities. SARCI MINIMUM FIELD QUALIFICATION

SARCI has expanded the minimum field qualification requirements for all groups to include PCSD-NIMS (formerly known as õNIMS-138ö) and Arizona Basic Search and Rescue training. These requirements became effective at the end of 2014. Please refer to the SARCI Field Qual Report (available on-line or from Records) to see who needs to complete these classes.

The SARCI Field Qualification minimum requirements shall include all of the following:

- SARCI Orientation
- Wilderness First Aid as certified by ASHI, or equivalent
- CPR for the Professional Rescuer as certified by ARC or AHA, or equivalent
- National Incident Management System (NIMS) IS-100 and IS-700, or equivalent
- Effective 12/31/2014: Pima County Sheriff's Department local protocols, commonly referred to as õPCSD-NIMSÖ (aka NIMS-138)
- Effective 12/31/2014: Arizona Basic Search and Rescue as defined by the Arizona Search and Rescue Coordinators Association, or equivalent, commonly referred to as õAZ-Basicö

SARA BOARD OF DIRECTORS ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Board has determined that there were no substantive changes that needed to be made in the new policies based on the conversation at the general meeting, and intends to pass the new policies at the January meeting, per the process defined in the policies. Minor changes, including the language changes suggested by the members at the meeting are underway. A clean draft of the new policies will be posted to the data section of the SARA website once those changes are complete.

SARA dues for fiscal year 2015-2016 will be \$75 and are due and payable on May 1, 2015. If your dues are received by the Treasurer on or before May 1, there will be a \$40 discountô you pay only \$35. If dues are received by the Treasurer after May 1, but before June 1, there will be a \$20 discountô you pay \$55. After May 30, the full amount of \$75 will be due. If dues are not received by the Treasurer by the date of the July Board meeting, you will be dropped from membership in SARA as of that date for non-payment.

SARA TRAINING

The Winter Skills/Alpine Rescue training is upcoming. Many of the details have to be considered a bit tentative, as we still await the arrival of winter (hopefully before summer comes back).

This training will be presented in two parts. First we will have a classroom session on Wednesday 07 January, 18:30 at the SARA House. This classroom session is a mandatory component of the training. This requirement is waived for those who attended last year, but attendance is still strongly encouraged. We expect the classroom session will last around 3 hours and will be an introduction to equipment and other considerations that facilitate safe operations in winter conditions. Please bring your rescue pack and outdoor clothes as there may be a field activity.

The field portion of the training will be on Saturday 10 January (note this is a week later than normal, to avoid the holiday weekend). Preliminary rendezvous will be 08:00 at PCSO Substation 106, Catalina Hwy and Tanque Verde. This could change depending on conditions on the mountain and we will let you know if a change occurs. The field session will consist of hands-on practice moving over snow and ice with snowshoes/crampons, making shelter/fire on snow, snow anchors, and methods to evacuate a patient over snow and ice. We are planning to include a steep angle exercise utilizing the MPD systems on snow at the end of the training. Please plan for a full day on the mountain. The training should be a lot of fun, even if you have participated in previous years we encourage you to attend again.

Remember this may be a sign-off for candidates if you don't already have it, and it is an important practice for anyone who may respond to a call in the snow.

FIELD QUALIFICATION TRAINING

Everyone is required to participate in a Technical Skills field exercise annually in order to remain field-qualified. This means you have to do it within one year of the last time you attended. There will be only four opportunities to do this in 2015: January 31, April 25, July 25, and October 31. Each date is the last Saturday of the first month of a quarter. You might want to plan for a refresher that is one cycle ahead of the date your qualification expires. Otherwise, you might be non-field-qualified until the following session in three months.

The first Technical Skills field exercise of 2015 will be on Saturday, January 31, and you must register for the exercise before attending. Contact Dale Mann at <u>dale1947sailor @ gmail.com</u> to register. Rendezvous will be at 106 at 08:00. If you have NOT seen the Awareness PowerPoint presentation at least once, you must do that prior to the field exercise. If you need to see it, make sure you say that in your email. There are 29 people who need to attend the refresher in January, so register early.


NSP did upgrade their system this year and they are working out the bugs. If you have a problem with your NSP records please forward any questions to John Gorski.

They intended to hike up Pima and down Alamo, but were unable to find that canyon (itos not easy) and continued down Montrose. After dark they were not close to being out, and werenot sure of their location and called for help (a helicopter flying by may have had an effect). SAR teams were just returning to the previous scene, and lights were visible up Montrose Canyon. A team dropped into the canyon bottom and met the pair a short distance upstream. All walked back to the trail and down to the trailhead without problems. Our new yellow shirts got to play!
