Planning a nice ride at Saguaro East, a gentleman was following Debi and Grady in through the Wildhorse entrance this past weekend (2-16-15). There was a commotion behind Debi and Grady followed by a thud, someone hit the ground. Debi turned and found the gentleman on the ground with the wind knocked out of him. She called 911 to report a loose horse running down Speedway and a possible injured person on the ground. 911 did ask for the street address of the GATE. Not available, no numbers at East End Speedway. A little frustrated Debi stopped the conversation in order to chase the horse, still running down Speedway. The Gentleman got up off the ground still stumbling, catching the breath that was removed from his lungs upon impact with the ground. Both parties blocked Speedway east and west with their horse towing rigs, the horse in the middle. Keeps the horse from colliding with automobiles. One driver actually drove out of the road around the road block to go on his way. Grady did stop the car, Debi catches up to the car and attempts to educate the driver on why the road was blocked. SARA DUES

SARA dues for fiscal year 2015-2016 will be \$75 and are due and payable on May 1, 2015. If your dues are received by the Treasurer on or before May 1, there will be a \$40 discount - you pay only \$35. If dues are received by the Treasurer after May 1, but before June 1, there will be a \$20 discount - you pay \$55. After May 30, the full amount of \$75 will be due. If dues are not received by the Treasurer by the date of the July Board meeting, you will be dropped from membership in SARA as of that date for non-payment. A letter to the Board will be required for reinstatement - plus \$75. If mailed, the postmark will determine the discount, if any.

SARA TRAINING

Changes to SARA Monthly Trainings

The topics of many monthly trainings will be gradually changing over the next year. Many basic level trainings that had been targeted mainly at new candidates are going to be phased out (in favor of covering that material in the SALT Program) and replaced by new trainings, or taught with a focus on more advanced topics. A survey was recently sent to all current SARA Candidates to help us make sure those still seeking their Orange Shirt will not be left out.

As part of this shift, many trainings will now require those wishing to participate to sign-up, usually at least a week or two ahead of time. This allows the instructor group to plan to have adequate instructors and equipment, and in some cases to pre-plan assignments -- all with the goal of putting forward a more efficient and valuable training. When a training requires a sign-up, a link to an online survey will be sent out on SARA-Announce at least a week before the deadline. Those who do not sign-up will NOT be allowed to participate in the training. If you sign-up and later become unavailable, please advise the lead instructor as soon as possible.

March Monthly Training: Tanque Verde Falls

March 07, Saturday. First, an orientation hike of the TV Falls area will be offered, introducing (or refreshing) everybody on the various features (and their names), trails/routes, and permanent rescue anchors. Please bring your full rescue pack, sturdy boots, and plenty of water. This training is a sign-off for candidates, but is also a good refresher for existing members. The hike itself will conclude around 11:00 and will be followed by a technical exercise.

Second, we will be holding a technical exercise. The exact nature of this exercise will be determined based on how many people sign up to participate. The TV Falls area has several permanent artificial anchors (of various types) that have been installed to aid in the construction of our rope systems, so this training should be a good opportunity to practice using different anchors than our typical sharp boulders or pointy mesquite trees.

Rendezvous will be at the Circle K just east of Tanque Verde and Tanque Verde Loop, and will be at two different times based on which portions of the training you wish to participate in.

Those who wish to participate in the Orientation should rendezvous at 07:30. Everyone participating in this hike will also be able to participate in the technical exercise. Those who only wish to participate in the technical exercise should rendezvous at 09:45.

24 HOURS IN THE OLD PUEBLO RECAP

As it has since 2008, SARA provided medical support for the 24 Hours in the Old Pueblo mountain bike race. This year, 73 patients were treated including one helicopter and three ambulance transports. The theme this year was road rash, lacerations, and trauma. At least one person owes their life to SARA as first medical responders and to personnel from Golder Ranch Fire Department, who provided more advanced care. Nineteen SARA members assisted with the medical mission at the event; several current and former members were involved in race communications, and the official Timekeeper and Results person is a SARA member. Once again SARA enjoyed a close working relationship with the paramedic and EMT from Golder Ranch Fire Department, who were stationed next to the Medical Tent. The interaction with GRFD was excellent with everyone working as a team.

12:45-17:40 A hiker injured her knee near the bottom of the switchbacks below Maiden Pools. She was carried out by stokes, and was able to walk with assistance through rough sections.

14:45 – 16:45 Two riders were thrown from horses. One was able to ride out with minimal injuries, the other struck her head and was unable to recall what had happened.
