SEARCH AND RESCUE

Sometimes SAMSAR is requested to assist in horse rescues. We had two at the same time. #1 rescue: One horse was upside down on Pink Hill Trail in Saguaro Park East. George, Kay, Jerry and Kathryn responded to that. BEST outcome. Horse got up by itself just as George and Kay arrived. BEST information, George to horse owner. (Take the rope off, let it rest, we are on the way). F.Y.I. In large animal rescue, keep calm, the animal reacts to your stress. Herget and Simmons are certified large animal rescuers. #2 rescue: Colleen and Frank were called off Saguaro, redirected to Hughes Access Road. Loose horse with full tack and injuries. Found the horse had a bad cut on its rear leg and also cut its tongue half into. Loaded the injured horse for the owner to transport to awaiting vet. This was not easy. Hurt animals do not want to move. Take experience to load an injured horse, got to love and respect the physical size of the animal to get its trust. Colleen and Frank did just that. Was nice to have the support of the Sheriff's Office, controlling traffic and people. Thanks to the Deputy. Good job Colleen and Frank. The Sheriff's Office, SARA, and Golder Ranch Fire were working a double horse incident in the Golder Ranch area from earlier (injured people, not horses). That's three horse accidents in one afternoon.

When SAMSAR is split, dual assignments one for fed. and one S.O. I like the fact we can use the ham radios because Mykle (SARA) is listening and his help can be solicited by just hitting the radio key and asking him for assistance. May need foot people or radio relay. You never know how two rescues will go. Back up is a stress reduction benefit. Thanks Mykle.

We were called this very windy weekend (15th March) to help assist in locating a lost horse on the Empire Ranch Endurance ride. Riders from all over the state attend this popular ride. Thanks to our own Debi Mitchell (who is back in the saddle after a serious and long illness) for coordinating efforts to assist in locating this horse. Horse was found while five SAMSAR members were on their way! Very happy the horse was found safe. I hate the wind, too many horse-eaters lurking in the wind. Thanks to George, Frank, Colleen, Jerry and Diana.

SARA DUES

SARA dues for fiscal year 2015-2016 will be \$75 and are due and payable on May 1, 2015. If your dues are received by the Treasurer on or before May 1, there will be a \$40 discount - you pay \$35. If dues are received by the Treasurer after May 1 and before June 1, there will be a \$20 discount - you pay \$55. After May 30, the full amount of \$75 will be due. If dues are not received by the Treasurer by the date of the July Board meeting, you will be dropped from membership in SARA as of that date for non-payment. A letter to the Board will be required for reinstatement - plus \$75. If mailed, the postmark will determine the discount, if any.

We raised over \$3500 from the previous raffle to support our annual budget. Let's see if we can exceed that this time. Tickets can be obtained from the SARA Store or from me.


