The Neotoma Composite Squadron in preparing for participation in the U.S. Air Force "Angel Thunder" again this year, the nation's largest and most realistic joint service, multinational, interagency search and rescue exercise using a variety of scenarios to simulate deployment conditions and contingencies. The squadron will provide ground team and K-9 team resources to the exercise.

The Squadron is honored to receive a \$10,000 donation, and \$10,000 pledge from former Neotoma Composite Squadron cadet Troy Olhausen and his wife Kelly, to aid in medical training, equiptment and general expenses over the next five years. The generous donation includes sponsorships for first aid and CPR training, as well as five years of scholarships for cadets enrolling in the EMT program at Pima Community College. The Olhausen donation also matches 2015 general squadron fundraising up to \$5,000.

Once again, the Arizona Wing received the highest possible "outstanding" rating from the U.S. Air Force during the air and ground evaluated operations exercise April 25. The ground team received an "outstanding" as well for the third consecutive year. The SAR exercise operated from Falcon Field in Mesa, with bases also set up in Deer Valley and Tucson. The exercise tested air and ground teams assigned multiple scenarios in various locations throughout the state. USAF evaluators from as far away as Nevada and New Mexico gathered to test the SAR capabilities of the Arizona Wing's ICS management teams as well as air and ground operations.

Congratulations to 2Lt Nancy Smith and K9 Juliette on receiving their Cadaver Detection Certification from the North American Search Dog Network.

The Civil Air Patrol's Neotoma Squadron actively participates in ongoing search and rescue missions and training exercises at the state and local levels. We welcome new members to join 32,000 trained emergency services members nationwide.

TRAINING

SAR conference in Heber Az., May 01-03. SAMSAR Team: Colleen, Jerry, Frank, Kay and our Deputy Brian Boll went to Heber to train other equine Search and Rescue teams: Hauling Equipment, Hauling Patients/subjects, Line search procedures and how foot people/non equine personnel work on-trail with the horses and mules during callouts.

The SAMSAR Instructors were led by Colleen. We found out really quick why these classes were requested. Way too lengthy to explain. All students were good people with good attitudes. We recommended additional training also. In the equipment hauling class, attempted to hand the riders back packs, and intro back pack to horses. A lot learned in a four hour period. Two pretty good rodeos. Students learned not all horses are S&R ready. No injuries in this class. The hauling/loading patients/subjects went well. Rough at first, got a lot better as we went on. No rodeos. Used Chapo and Kay as patient to illustrate. Kay had the hard job! Excellent feedback from Kay to students. Then we used Coy's horse from northern AZ area. All trainees were able to do hands on. Stressed slow down, communications and patience.

The line search went well in the open field after repetitive walk through. Colleen said the woods are quite different than the Desert! Her heart rate was elevated to say the least. Was interesting watching all the horses and mule working together, especially since only a few knew each other. We had 21 in class. Working with equine while on a search or rescue for foot people, Non equine. Was very interesting. We had dog exposure to horses. Approaching the horses, do's and don'ts. Ask the rider/owner before approaching. And what may happen if you don't THINK around animals. Not an ATV, you don't just turn the key off and they stop working.

Helo fly by and hover: After Colleen told all riders they may want to get off their mounts, we still had a horse going up and over. There is a method SAMSAR people use to keep the horse under saddle and under control. I think and hope that all students learned what NOT to do. Brian and Colleen attended to the down rider. No broken bones. Left a mark though. Meanwhile, Frank and I were instructing line search formation. Getting them ready for the wooded line search Colleen loved so well.

A big thanks to Aaron Dick of Coconino county for overseeing the SAR event. What a great group of people attending. And thanks Deputy Boll for helping us all the way. Yes we did use our Deputy during classes.

Congratulations to SARA for their award. Pima County Search and Rescue was well represented.

SARA DUES

SARA dues for fiscal year 2015-2016 will be \$75 and are due and payable on May 1, 2015. If your dues are received by the Treasurer on or before May 1, there will be a \$40 discount - you pay \$35. If dues are received by the Treasurer after May 1 and before June 1, there will be a \$20 discount - you pay \$55. After May 30, the full amount of \$75 will be due. If dues are not received by the Treasurer by the date of the July Board meeting, you will be dropped from membership in SARA as of that date for non-payment. A letter to the Board will be required for reinstatement - plus \$75. If mailed, the postmark will determine the discount, if any.

2014 ARIZONA SEARCH AND RESCUE UNIT OF THE YEAR

The Southern Arizona Rescue Association has been honored with the 2014 Al Schoenstene Search and Rescue Unit of the Year award of the Arizona Search and Rescue Coordinators Association. The award was presented to the SARA "in appreciation for your contribution and dedication toward the search and rescue efforts for the state of Arizona, its sheriffs and coordinators."

"SARA volunteers are excited and appreciative of the nomination and ultimate award as rescue unit of the year in Arizona," said Eric Davis, president of SARA. This is the first year the organization has received the award, which is considered for all foot, canine, and mounted SAR units in Arizona.

SARA was nominated, and subsequently received, the 2014 Unit of the Year award for the initiative and resourcefulness shown in the successful implementation of several organizational changes during the past year to improve training and rescue efforts. Such changes include implementation of the SAR Awareness Level Training (SALT) program, which integrates the Arizona SAR Basic training with technical rescue awareness and additional trainings into a cohesive instructional program for candidate members. SARA's Technical Rescue Group (TRG) achieved certification by the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD), providing individual technician-level rope rescue certification to TRG members. Additionally, PCSD-certified awareness-level standards for technical roperescue have been implemented for all SARA membership. Finally, Wilderness First Responder (WFR) has been adopted as SARA's minimum standard for medical training replacing Outdoor Emergency Care, with Lee Ryan organizing and leading instruction of the new WFR curriculum. The program was implemented this year for the first time for the newest candidate class.

All was accomplished while SARA volunteers contributed 13,707 hours to 208 trainings and 3,068 hours to 100 SAR missions, and provided medical support for events statewide including the 24 Hours in the Old Pueblo, Tour of the White Mountains, and Whiskey Off Road mountain bike races.

"The members of SARA dedicate countless hours and hard work for training and mission preparation to provide the highest level of mountain rescue readiness for the residents and visitors of Pima County," Davis noted.

The Al Schoenstene award is one of three, including the Don Hornecker Coordinator of the Year and Joe Young Volunteer of the Year awards, given every year by the Arizona Search and Rescue Coordinators Association (ASARCA) to eligible SAR organizations. The award honors late Arizona Search and Rescue Coordinator Al Schoenstene, a Maricopa County SAR coordinator during the advent of ASARCA. ASARCA promotes land SAR professionalism and education by facilitating information exchange among state SAR organizations.
