The Neotoma Composite Squadron's ground team has been active in locating and deactivating non-distress ELT beacons from small aircraft in the Tucson area. Lt. Col. Robert McCord and Lt. Col. Laura Markewicz were dispatched in the Coolidge area Oct. 7; 2Lt. Nancy Smith was dispatched in the Tucson area on Oct. 8. Additionally, Cols. McCord and Markewicz joined Lt. Col. Andrea Mullen, 1Lt. Ed Pound and Lt. Smith locating a non-distress beacon at Marana Regional Airport Oct. 19.

Squadron members have advanced the Arizona Ground Team's goal of meeting ASTM search and rescue standards by receiving certifications from the National Association of Search and Rescue (NASAR). Lt. Col Andrea Mullen/canine Delta, 2d Lt. Nancy Smith/canine Mocha and Senior Member Deborah Henschen/canine Rosie earned Type IV certification for Human Remains Detection in November. SM Henschen/Rosie received NASAR certification for Type I wilderness airscent in August. All handlers are required to be NASAR SARTECH II qualified.

The Civil Air Patrol's Neotoma Squadron actively participates in ongoing search and rescue missions and training exercises at the state, local and national levels. We welcome new members to join the more than 700 members of the nationally recognized emergency services Arizona Wing Ground Team.

### MONTHLY TRAINING

The monthly training for December will be Land Navigation. This is an Orange Card sign-off.

There will be a classroom session on Wednesday 02 December, beginning at 18:00 at the SARA House. Material to be covered includes topographic map reading, using a map with a compass, and the basics of GPS usage. At the end of the classroom session there will be a couple of short field exercises so please come prepared with appropriate footwear/clothing and your rescue pack. The classroom session is not strictly mandatory, but will be beneficial particularly to newer people as the field session will not have much in the way of instruction.

The field session will be on Saturday 05 December, beginning at 09:00 and will also start at the SARA House. The training will consist of a land navigation course around the Sabino Canyon area, with each leg of the course designed to test a specific skill. Candidates and members alike are encouraged to attend, experienced rescuers will be very helpful assisting teams. Those who attended previous years are also encouraged to participate and can help guide the newer candidates. The course is designed to utilize various navigation skills, including using various functions of your GPS unit that could be helpful on a SAR mission.

Those of you who own a GPS should bring it, and make sure you have read (or at least skimmed) the owner manual.
