SARA TRAINING

The next monthly training will be held on Saturday, March 5. It will be a combination of the Tangue Verde Falls orientation and a technical rescue exercise.

If you haven't done this orientation, or you haven't done it in a long time, please plan now to attend. We get a few calls every year in this area, and it can be confusing in the daytime, let alone at night.

For the orientation, meet at 08:00, Saturday, March 5, at the Circle K on the north side of Tanque Verde Road, just east of the intersection with Tanque Verde Loop Road. Please park up on the berm to the east of the store, not on the pavement or the dirt road. Helmets are required.

The technical exercise will be run as a full rescue. There will be an injured person who must be treated medically and brought up a slope with a rope system. We will rig for a steep slope, even though the actual slope will be under 40°. This may be at the Turkey Chute anchor or the Trolley anchor. Helmets are required for the rescue. Attendants on the Stokes will need to have a seat harness, a chest harness, and several personal Prusiks and carabiners.

We will soon be looking for new members for the Technical Rescue Group (TRG), and this training will be good preparation for those who are interested.

If you are coming for the technical rescue only, rendezvous will be at 11:00 along Redington Road, next to the trail to the upper helicopter LZ. Several of our cars will be parked along the road. Beware of flying trucks, SUVs, motorcycles, and ATVs.

Watch for a Whoozin sign-up for this training.

24 Hours in the Old Pueblo Recap

SARA provided medical support for the 24 Hours in the Old Pueblo mountain bike race. This year, 63 patients were treated including two helicopter and three ambulance transports. The theme this year was road rash, clavicles, and facial trauma. At least one person owes their life to SARA as medical first responders and to personnel from Golder Ranch Fire Department, who provided more advanced care. Twenty three SARA members assisted with the medical mission at the event. In SARA-Speak the summary is 55 people, 613 hours. Several current and former members were involved in race communications. In addition, the race Timekeeper and his assistant are current SARA members. This was the fourth year that an EMT-P and EMT from Golder Ranch Fire Department were stationed next to the Medical Tent. SARA again enjoyed a close working relationship with the GRFD crew.

The next race in the EPIC Ride Series is the Whiskey Off-Road (WOR) in Prescott Arizona. The dates for that race are April 29 to May 1. More information on the WOR will be coming in March.
