I am amazed at the help from SARA again. The arena training is really showing up. I asked the subject which way she preferred to be hauled out? "Oh my gosh the mule!". Told her SARA had to get her to us for haul out. She agreed. I still couldn't get her to tell the SARA troops the mule was the best ride.

Thanks Deputy Brian for telling Colleen I only dropped the subject three times but she got up and got back on. Colleen would have believed you until you said THREE times. Now I know why we let the young people walk out leading the haul horse. Rough trail. Was fun, beautiful day. SAMSAR working hard to put more Saddles in the field.

**APRIL MONTHLY TRAINING:** Swift water rescue on the Gila River, northeast of Winkleman.

Meet 07:00 Saturday April 02 in the Walmart parking lot at the corner of Oracle Road and Tangerine Road. This will be an all-day activity, so bring sufficient sunscreen, food, and water. There will be no pool session this year, but if you plan to go into the water, you must be able to swim well without a flotation device. No exceptions.

Required equipment includes, but is not limited to, your full rescue pack, helmet, shoes/boots to wear in the water, and at least a short wetsuit. This is needed because the water is cold, and there may be underwater hazards, such as branches or barbed wire. Wetsuits may be rented at a local dive shop. A Coast Guard-approved personal flotation device (PFD) is also required; SARA has some, but if you have your own, please bring it.

21:00 – 23:40 A hiker was unable to follow the trail after dark and called for help. Survey1 provided a variety of coordinates that finally settled on trail just below Maiden Pools. She had also called a friend who was on trail before any teams. He retrieved her and met the teams on the switchbacks and continued out without problems.				
<b>Fri Mar 04</b>	<b>1/ 2/</b>	<b>??yf hiker lost</b>	<b>Catalina St Pk, Catalinas</b>	
19:20 – 21:10 Two hikers became separated while returning from Romero Pools, and one reported the other missing. She reported that she was out at a house and provided an address that was not valid. One SARA Truck remained with family at the trailhead until the hiker was located and returned to the group.				
<b>Sat Mar 05</b>	<b>24/ 45/</b>	<b>Injured canine, dehydrated hiker</b>	<b>TV Canyon, Rincons</b>	
11:55 – 13:50 A male hiked down the old “Middle Route” into TV Canyon, between the SARA Trail and the LZ. One of his two dogs fell and was unable to walk. He carried the heavy dog up the route, then became exhausted and called for help. A training exercise was in progress nearby, so teams were quickly on scene. The dog was carried by stokes, and the hiker was rehydrated and hiked out with his second dog. The dog had a fractured shoulder, and was expected to recover.

19:15 – 19:55 Hikers became apprehensive about hiking after sunset and in rain showers. The hasty team met them a few feet from the trailhead, and the call quickly cancelled.

16:00 – 19:20 A male hiking with family sat down in sight of the falls while the rest continued to the falls. They noticed a crowd around the subject as bystanders reacted to a cardiac arrest and performed CPR. Tucson Ranger dropped a medic at the falls, who declared the subject deceased. Rescue teams carried the hiker to the falls and he was flown to the LZ.

She was assisted down trail to the stokes, rode the stokes until meeting a SAMSAR team, then rode a mule to the trailhead.
