On 18 Feb, two cadets and two seniors from Neotoma Composite Squadron, presented the National Association of Search and Rescue (NASAR) Hug-A-Tree program to 13 1st-3rd grade girls from the American Heritage Girls group of Oro Valley, AZ.

The Hug-a-Tree program was developed to educate children in a select few of the most basic and vital survival principles. It was specifically designed for children between the ages of 7 and 11 but can be effective with slightly younger and older children. The program consists of a video and demonstrations in which school-aged children learn methods of not getting lost, what to do if lost, and techniques to stay calm and protected from the elements if lost.

Following the video portion of the program, with a few of the girls' help, CAP Cadets Jordan Madison and Wolfgang Wischki demonstrated the use of a plastic garbage bag which should be carried whenever hiking, as a potential shelter, rain-gear, signaling device, etc. The CAP cadets also assisted the girls in making aluminum foil footprints - an activity which should be done prior to any outing with their families - which would be useful to have as an example for searchers to help locate them if they should get lost. Capt Silvia Scotti and SM Bryan Kelsey demonstrated effective attention-getting methods such as the use of whistles (vs yelling) and stressed the importance of bright clothing.

The girls asked pertinent questions of the team and seemed to enjoy learning new things.

Many children are alive today because of their experience with the Hug-a-Tree program.

The Civil Air Patrol's Neotoma Squadron actively participates in ongoing search and rescue missions and training exercises at the state, local and national levels. We welcome new members to join the more than 70 members of the nationally recognized emergency services Arizona Wing Ground Team.

The monthly training will be on Saturday, May 14; the training will be on personal rope skills. Rendezvous will be at 106 at 0800. Please be early enough to arrange carpooling, so that we can leave at 08:00.

Bring your full rescue pack and sufficient food and fluids to last for the day. Training will continue into the afternoon, and we may expect it to be either warm or hot.

Helmets will be required. Additionally, you will need a commercially-made seat harness, either a climbing harness or a rescue harness. If you don't have one, you may be able to borrow one from another member, but that arrangement is up to you. We will not have extra harnesses to lend. You will also need at least three rated locking carabiners.

A chest harness is recommended, but not required. One can be improvised from 10 feet of 1-inch tubular webbing.

The training will be on descending and ascending a fixed rope. SARA members will have a variety of rappel devices available; there are dozens, if not hundreds, of designs.

Ascending the rope will be done using Purcell Prusiks. We will not use mechanical ascenders. There will be a classroom session on Wednesday, May 11, at 18:30, and as a part of that, you will be shown how to tie a set of Purcell Prusiks if you don't have them. You will need to bring 33 feet (10 m) of 6mm or 7mm rope. Don't buy rope that seems very stiff; it will not grip the fixed rope well enough for you to climb. Don't buy 6mm rope if you weigh more than 180 pounds; it may grip the rope too well.

If you have questions, please contact myself or any TRG member.

TRAINING COMMITTEE: looking for members; its charter is to plan for the monthly trainings and to arrange for instructors. Both orange and yellow shirts are eligible to serve. The committee also needs a volunteer to be the chairperson and coordinate its activities.
