Our most common interaction with DPS Ranger is being inserted or retrieved in the back country and is one of the most hazardous activities a SARA member will experience. The purpose of this training is to provide familiarization with the procedures for getting in and out of a running helicopter safely in varied terrain.

NSP is changing the way they do business on August 1st. One of the changes is that the NSP Associate Membership (required as part of OEC refreshers) is increasing by \$5.00. SARA will charge half for admin costs this year to keep the total the same.

Our first OEC Cycle "C" refresher date is Sunday, August 21st. Instructors arrive at 07:00; the refresher will start promptly at 08:00. The second refresher will he held on Saturday, September 17th.



Due to the heat, no teams were started on foot. Ranger 54 was unable to drop off a rescuer near the pair due to winds, so used Romero Pass and delivered a second rescuer. They hiked down, and then they hiked up until reaching the hikers. They were chilly, but responded to jackets, food and water. The group hiked down to the helispot above Hutchs' Pool and were retrieved by Ranger.
