24 HOURS IN THE OLD PUEBLO

This year, the 24 Hours in the Old Pueblo will be held on February 17-19. SARA's primary obligation is to provide medical support during the race, February 18-19. Thursday, mid to late afternoon, we will need six to eight people to erect the medical tent. A small crew is needed the afternoon of Friday the 17th to provide care for those pre-riding the course.

As you can see, there are lots of opportunities to help with this event. As for the race itself, you do not need to be there for the entire event. We can accommodate most personal schedules. However, four hours is about the minimum workable time span. Don't forget your travel time, about 2.5 to 3 hours in total.

This is a great event and provides terrific hands-on practice for your medical skills. We typically treat >75 patients so there is plenty for everyone to do. To participate, you must be a fully field-qualified member of SARA at the time of the event. This includes both current medical (WFR, or higher, and CPR) and field-skills certifications. Qualified candidates are welcome.

The Pinal County Permit for this race has some stipulations regarding staffing. Therefore, it is crucial that you let me know if you would like to participate and the hours you would like to work, so that I can make a schedule addressing Pinal County's, Epic Rides', and our (SARA's) requirements.

There is camping at the venue (free for us), if you wish to stay for the duration. The venue is located about nine miles in on the Willow Springs Ranch Rd and then another mile to the west on a rougher track. More details will be coming in future emails. An email saying that you can't help also is appreciated and will allow me to remove your name from the contact list saving you a lot of irrelevant informational emails.

Once again it is very important that you email or call me (520-784-1784), if you are interested in helping with the 24HOP. This is the only planned communication that will be addressed to SARA-announce. All other communications will be to the individual SARA members via personal email addresses.

If you have questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me. Hope to see you out there. Also, the Epic Rides web site has a lot of useful information.

FEBRUARY FITNESS CHALLENGE

The challenge this month is something different. The AZSAR coordinators are working on a task book of recommended standards for volunteers, and a part of this could be a pack test. They are looking to set a standard for carrying a 25-pound pack over a 2 mile course on *level ground*, and they would like to collect data from a large number of people.

This can be done individually; however, during the test you will be covered by a state training mission number for Workman's Comp. Because of this, Deputy Jeremy Ramirez MUST be notified before doing the test. You may send an email to *Jeremy.Ramirez* @ *sheriff.pima.gov*, or a text to 520-940-5887.

Before starting the test, send a message with your name and the location. After finishing, send another message with your name and the elapsed time for the test. The preliminary standard for the test is 30 minutes, but please report your time honestly even if it is greater; otherwise, there is no validity for the results. Names and associated times will not be shared.

IMPORTANT: Your pack must weigh very close to 25 pounds for consistency of results. The course must be on *level ground* and be *2 miles* in length. Preference would be 8 laps around an oval school track for accuracy. Remember that this is a *walking* test; do not run or jog.

Udall Park and Reid Park have walking paths, there are the walking paths along the Rillito and Santa Cruz River Parks, and there are plenty of level streets in the city. In those cases, distance must be measured accurately by GPS unit. (For best accuracy, use "yards" as your unit of measure; 2 miles is 3,520 yards.) A long straight stretch is better than walking around and around a block.

Please do the pack test before February 25 and report your information to Jeremy. Contact him if you have any questions.






