

MEDICAL MOMENT

Wilderness First Responder Monthly CME schedule will start in May. The first topic will be Heat Injuries. Date to be announced, keep an eye on SARA-Announce. CME will be offered for EMTs and Paramedics as well.

In conjunction with SAMSAR we've reviewed our guidelines for patient with lower extremity injuries who are evacuated by horseback. Below are some guidelines to help in decision making regarding patients who are a good candidate for horseback evacuation versus other methods.

- Horse evacuation is an excellent platform for carrying out patients with simple lower extremity injuries out of the back country, and saves the patients and the team the added risk of a stokes carry-out.
- Lower extremity injuries that can be splinted with standard accepted splinting methods utilizing SAM splints and other rigid materials are excellent candidates for horseback evacuation.
- Patients with more significant lower extremity injuries requiring more definitive splinting with the sandwich splint are not good candidates for horseback evacuation, and other methods should be considered.
- Patients whose pain is such that they cannot safely be relied on to keep themselves upright on the horse are not good candidates for horseback evacuation.
- Patients whose fracture needs to be elevated or will not tolerate have it dangling are not good candidates for horseback evacuation.

Again these are general guidelines to help us make the best decisions for our patients and our rescuers. Every patient encounter requires a great deal of individual decision making, as always if in doubt contact medical control.

16:05 ó 18:30 A hiker tripped on the trail and injured his wrist. It was too painful to walk. A SARA member met the patient and provided a basic splint so he could walk slowly until meeting the hasty team with a better splint. All walked out.

13:50 ó 16:30 A hiker became exhausted above x7. The hasty team provided refreshments and walked her down to the Horse Around. She rode out without problems.

Wed Apr 12 9/ 47/ ??yf hiker off trail Box Camp Trail, Catalinas Survey1

22:10 ó 04:05 A hiker was unable to find a way out of Sabino Canyon and called for help. The hasty team dropped down a ridge from the north end of the Old Lookout on the Box Camp Trail. They drowned her fire and walked slowly uphill to the trail, and out.

Sat Apr 15 17/ 63/ 25ym stranded on rock Nancy's Thumb, Windy Point, Catalinas MLFD

17:30 ó 21:20 A male climbed Nancy Thumb (5.4) and was unable to climb down. A SARA climber prepared anchors from the bolts on top and the subject was lowered to the ground. The climber cleaned up and got off the rock, and all returned to the parking lot.

16:10 - 17:00 While the previous call was in progress, two women returning down Tanque Verde Canyon missed the SARA Trail and became exhausted while scrambling up the slope. A team from Bear Canyon responded and quickly reached the hikers from the cattle guard and retrieved them without problems.

10:20 ó 11:20 A hiker injured her ankle a short distance up the Pontatoc Trail. She was splinted and carried out by stokes.

16:30 ó 18:10 Two hikers were returning from Bridalveil Falls and ran out of water. The wife continued to the Visitors Center and called for help. A team went up Bird Canyon to the husband, provided refreshments, and all returned without problems.

Sun Apr 23 21/111/22yf hiker ankle injury 7 Falls, Bear Canvon, Catalinas Sheriff1 RMFD

16:55 ó 22:50 A female injured her ankle at 7 Falls and was unable to walk. She was carried by stokes to Crossing 7, then was reporting loss of sensation in her foot. Sheriff1 hoisted her to the Overlook LZ for transfer to Rural Metro.
